There was a meeting of the Southwest Region the day before actual convention sessions. The meeting was hosted by both incoming and outgoing, Southwest Region Directors. New Southwest Region Director is Heinz Johnson from San Antonio. Awards were presented to both individuals and clubs. The Sun Country Striders was awarded a certificate and streamer in recognition of 25 years as an active volkspport club. Doyle Piland was awarded a certificate in recognition of his long service to volksporting.

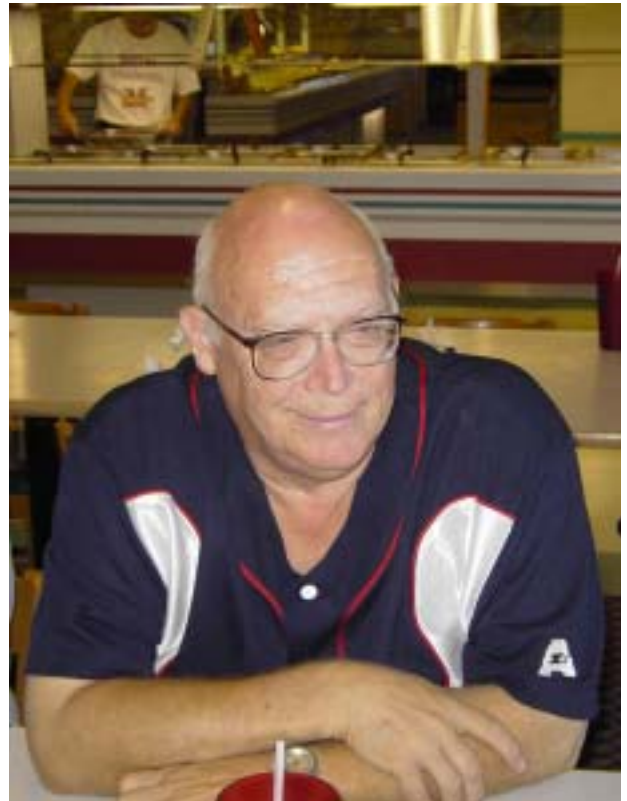
A long discussion about the next AVA convention was held. This convention in June 2009 will be held in Richardson, Texas, which is a suburb on the northeast side of Dallas. This will be unusual in that it is a cooperative venture between Southwest and South Central Regions.

The two major actions during the actual convention included elections

of national officers and choice of 2011 convention site. Curt Myron was elected the new President and John Ferguson—outgoing Southwest Director—became Vice-President. Des Moines, Iowa was chosen as the site of the 2011 convention.

Now some personal background about me. I was introduced to volksmarching in a very common way—by being stationed in Germany with the Army. In 1979, I was stationed in Hanau and got very involved in the activity. When I returned to the US, I thought my favorite pastime was over. But then I found an event of the Sun Country Striders and was glad to continue. I wanted to see a club in El Paso, so with a lot of help from the Sun Country

Striders, I was able to get a club started at Ft Bliss called the Windwalkers. I served as president there until I had to return to Germany. 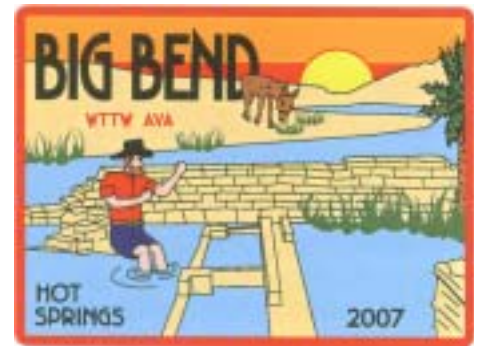
