Featured This Month

Land of Enchantment: Memoirs of Marian Russell along the Santa Fe Trail

These memoirs reveal a strong, energetic woman whose perceptions of old Santa Fe and pioneer life on the trail paint a vivid picture of the mid to late 1800's.

Buckboard Days by Sophie A. Poe

A fascinating history of the Lincoln/Roswell, New Mexico area unfolds through Mrs. Poe's account of her life with her husband William Henry Poe.

Madame Millie by Max Evans

A candid biography of an old "friend" and very unusual person, complemented by an excellent array of photos.

Born on a New Mexico cattle ranch in 1875, when the wild west was a reality, the author tells of the building of the railroad line from Trinidad, Colorado to El Paso, Texas through the history of her family and in particular of her father, W.R. Morley, a well-known construction engineer for the Santa Fe Rail Road.

Lazy B by Sandra Day O'Connor and Alan Day

Set in Arizona and New Mexico, the remarkable story of the Day Family and the early life of a United States Supreme Court justice growing up on a vast cattle ranch.
