April 11th - Guest Speaker

Jude Duran, a San Juan River fly fishing guide, commercial fly tier, and fly fishing instructor will discuss fly fishing micro-patterns in the famous San Juan River tail water and in other rivers and lakes where these tiny (size 18-26) flies are predominant. He will describe the most effective techniques for fishing small flies, setting up and casting double-fly nymph rigs, strike indicators, reading the water and review the best patterns to imitate these small insects. Rio Peñasco Improvement Project

Several Club members met on the weekend of 12 March to plant seedlings in the next phase of the Rio Peñasco stream improvement project. We probably planted between 650 and 700 seedlings, poles, and slips. Paul Turner had ordered the following bareroot seedlings from NM state forestry: 275 peachleaf willow, 50 hybrid cottonwood, 25 redosier dogwood and 25 chokecherry. In addition, he got 49 small containerized black willows. He had cut a large number of black willow slips and poles and some Rio Grande cottonwood slips from the along the Rio Grande just above Caballo Reservoir two days earlier. Participating on Saturday were Paul Turner, Tom Wobbe, Jim Hulsey, Wade Hedgecoke, Gary Mann, Tom Morris, Randy McFerrin and Cal Stromberg. Tom Wobbe and Paul Turner stayed over on Sunday and finished planting what was left over from the previous day.

New Mexico Game & Fish Aquatic Research Education Prog.

At the last MVFF Board Meeting the Officers and Board of Directors met with Kevin Holiday who is the NM Game & Fish Aquatic Resource Coordinator. He is seeking volunteers for a special program that is being set up for fishing and aquatic educational clinics to be conducted for NM educators and students to get them better acquainted with the resources we have in New Mexico. The goal is to provide information to them that they may use in the classroom to further educate students about them and how to protect and preserve our streams, forests and other natural resources.

Volunteers are needed from various fishing clubs throughout the State to assist in the clinics. Volunteers will be asked to agree to donate 16 hours a year in helping with the program, primarily in the southern part of the state for our club. Each person who volunteers will be recognized with a special patch for your fishing vest and the satisfaction of helping out on this program.

We have agreed that our club will participate in this program and the NM Game & Fish will be seeking volunteers from the members who would like to participate in this worthwhile program. We will soon receive additional information for the program and will present it in a future meeting.



There are many knots that are useful for fishing. But, there are two that are easy to tie and if you can tie them you may not have much need for all of the others. These knots give close to full line strength and also work with fluorocarbon line. To become proficient at tying these knots start by using 10 or 12 pound test line, take these instructions, sit quietly in a chair and practice. Be careful with hooks. You may consider cutting the point from a hook to practice with just to eliminate the chance of hooking yourself.

Once you can tie the knots without looking at the instructions, tie each knot ten times per evening for a week. Sit in front of the television and practice. Quickly, you will develop your own way of twisting the line and making loops that work best for you. Then a couple of days before a trip, refresh your self. You will find that these knots work very well. One is presented here and the other will be presented next month.


I learned the first knot from Mike Guerin, a well known Florida guide, who learned it from Lefty Kreh. Several of us that know Mike call it *Mike'sTarpon Knot* but Lefty names it the Non-Slip Loop knot. Either way, it is a great knot for a streamer fly. The loop stays open allowing the eye of the hook to swing along the loop, which imparts more action to the streamer fly. We used this knot in Alaska and never had a failure.


Form an overhand knot in the tag end, but do not tighten.

3.




Wrap tag around standing line the recommended number of times. (7 turns - 8x to 3x, 5 turns - 2x to 0x, 4 turns - 20lb to 40lb, 3 turns - 40lb to 60lb, 2 turns - over 60lb)

5.




Wet and pull tight by pulling on both the tag and standing ends

2.



Thread tag end through hook eye and take back through overhand knot "hole". Make sure you go in the same side that the tag originally came out.

4.



Place tag end back through original overhand knot, *making sure to go in, the same side it came out*. Note: Keeping the overhand knot to less than 1/4- inch diameter will help keep the end loop smaller as well. Adjust down as needed.
