#### President's Corner

#### **Paul Turner**

My fishing fever has reached the stage where I will have to make a serious effort to cool it down. After I write this article and finish filing my tax return, I plan to call Dutch Salmon to make plans for a 1-day outing to the Gila near the Cliff Dwellings. According to Dutch, the river there is running clear and we should have the reach all to our own. Although I will need to come back the same day so I can be at the Kid's Fishing Clinic on Saturday, this trip is long overdue. I really enjoy fishing and wading or floating rivers in the spring. This need comes from growing up in the Ozarks of Missouri where the choices for this pursuit were a lot greater. However, the popularity of floating there has caused the number of floaters to increase at least 10-fold since I left for graduate school in 1966.

There are still many places in New Mexico where you can have the river all to yourself most of time and even places that few, if any, anglers ever wet a line. This is especially true for the 42-mile stretch of the Gila River from the junction of the west and east forks downstream to the mouth of Mogollon Creek. This reach of the river has smallmouth bass up to at least 20 inches and both channel and flathead catfish that exceed 10 pounds for anglers willing to revert to bait fishing for some excellent eating. You can also catch

the occasional trout and roundtail chub on flies in the upper portions of this reach, but the latter should be returned immediately to the river as they are protected by the state. I remember talking with some anglers once that had already caught and cleaned a number of chubs on the upper East Fork of the Gila River on a class field trip. They thought they were smallmouth bass and, considering that chubs are in the minnow family, they really were off base and would have been in big trouble if I had been a conservation officer for New Mexico Game and Fish. I told them of their mistake and suspect they kept pretty quiet about how many they had cleaned.

We will be stocking the Rio Peñasco in April but the date isn't set yet. The producer is still waiting for the OK to stock after his trout were sampled by Game and Fish to assure they are disease free. We plan to stock mainly 7 to 9-inch rainbow trout as these should not impact the growth and spawning of the adult rainbow and brown trout which are much larger and already adapted to the stream. If you read this soon enough, you should also try to help out on the club's Kids' Fishing Clinic at Alumni Pond at NMSU. Game and Fish will stock rainbow trout just before the free fishing clinic and have Ti Piper bring spinning rods and reels for kids without their own gear. Sportsman's Warehouse is providing a variety of free prizes for the kids and MVFF will provide pizza and drinks for the participants.

I also have bought my rod blank and materials for the flyrod-building class organized by MVFF that starts in May.

My bowling leagues, volleyball, and Senior Olympics are over by May so I can concentrate on fishing and travel for the rest of the spring and summer. I plan some fishing and floating in Idaho before my July trip to Alaska for kayaking and fishing with friends. I also will have enough miles for a free roundtrip flight with Alaska Airlines in time for the MVFF trip to Kodiak Island in September. We had a good turnout at our recent planning meeting so if you are interested in going you should contact Bob Silver or Tom Wobbe and make your travel plans fairly soon.

Remember if you're too busy to go fishing, you are too busy.

#### Kids' Fishing Clinic

Saturday, 5 April 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM

MVFF will hold their annual Kids' Fishing Clinic this year on 5 April at Alumni Pond at NMSU. Helping as sponsors will be the NM Dept. of Game & Fish and Sportsman's Warehouse. It will be conducted very similar to what has been done in past years. Kids will go through several learning stations and when they have "graduated" will be loaned fishing tackle and allowed to fish the pond. NMDG&F will stock the pond with trout prior to the event. Some of the stations will be Bugs, Knots, Fly Tying, Fish Guts, Regulations, Fish Identification, Casting and probably several others. The kids will be awarded prizes and will be fed pizzas and soft drinks at noon. participant must pre-register with the NMDG&F by calling 532-2100. An adult must accompany children attending the event. Volunteers will be needed just as in the past, so mark your calendars now.

#### **Project Healing Waters**

Board members have recently become MVFF interested in getting involved in something called Project Healing Waters, a project to assist in the rehabilitation of disabled military veterans. Randall Vallee and Chris Evey were delegated to coordinate and direct the efforts. Toward that end, they have had meetings with William Beaumont Hospital in El Paso, a military hospital associated with Fort Bliss. Initial meetings have gone very well and it appears that once the paper work is taken care of, MVFF members will conduct fly tying classes for the disabled veterans at William Beaumont and possibly conduct fishing outings at the lease. PROJECT HEALING WATERS FLY FISHING, Inc., initiated and conducted by members of the Federation of Fly Fishers and Trout Unlimited, serves military personnel who have been wounded, injured, or disabled to aid their physical and emotional recovery by introducing or rebuilding the skills of fly fishing and fly tying

and by using and enjoying these skills on fishing outings and as lifelong recreation. While initially focusing on the military personnel in the Washington, DC area, the Project has expanded nationwide and is offering its services and program to active military personnel and veterans in Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs hospitals throughout the country.

The Project relies on Federation of Fly Fishers, Trout Unlimited, and independent fly fishing clubs to conduct the program at the DOD and DVA hospitals across the nation. The volunteer staff and outings leaders include professional educators and fishing guides as well as experienced fly fishers, all of whom donate their time and knowledge to support the Project participants. Other volunteers help meet the educational, equipment, outings, training, and transportation needs.

#### **MVFF Board Meeting Minutes**

Monday, March 17, 2008

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F conference room.

In Attendance: Paul Turner, Randall and Vicki Vallee, Ron Bellerose, Chris Evey, Jim Hulsey, Gary Mann, Bob Silver, Richard Keding, Tom Wobbe, Jeremiah Richardson, Jeff Arterburn and Donna Mabie. Absent: George Sanders.

- Minutes of the February Board Meeting were approved as published in the March newsletter as well as the Treasurer's Report presented by Gary Mann.
- 2. Chris Evey gave a report on his and Randall Vallee's meeting with the staff of the Fort Bliss Restoration and Resilience Center (RRC) on March 13, 2008. Dr. John Fortunato (Lt. Colonel) is the RRC Director. Randall explained the Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) concept and discussed possible activities with the MVFF. The group agreed to begin with a 3 to 4 hour activity consisting of a flytying clinic and the showing of a flyfishing film or other instructional The 25 to 30 soldiers would be videos. divided into two groups alternating between the activities. MFVV will provide the flytying equipment, DVD, and volunteers for the events, hopefully to be held on Thursdays because it is the designated field day for the RRC. MVFF will coordinate with the staff to schedule a date for the event once the details are finalized. MVFF will pursue a waiver of NM fishing licensening from the NMDG&F, procure about 12 sets of flytying equipment (to be kept by the MVFF), determine and

- solicit volunteers for the project, schedule the date for the first event, plan the next two events between the club and RRC. MVFF will also sign a PHW Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between MVFF and PHWFFI. This MOA will be nonbinding to the Club.
- 3. The group further discussed the long-term plans for the PHW program such as field excursions, fly casting clinics, fishing days, etc. The flytying clinics will be held at Ft. Bliss. The Club agreed to purchase about 13 flyrods and reels as well as the items mentioned above, and flytying materials.
- 4. Volunteers from among the Board members signed up for different stations at the Kids' Fishing Clinic to be held April 5th. Walmart will not be participating this year so no gift bags will be provided by them. Sportsman's Warehouse will provide gifts and other items needed. Pizza and drinks will be provided by the club. It was agreed that \$250 would be used for these.
- 5. Discussion was held regarding the flyrod building clinic to be held at a meeting room at Sportsman's Warehouse. The clinic will be taught by Joseph Lopez. Equpment will be purchased through Sportsman's Warehouse and ordered from Temple Fork. Other items will need to be ordered from Cabellas. Coordination will be made with Thomas See of Sportsman's Warehouse.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:05 p.m.

#### **CDC Emerger**

The center of attention for the Liars and Tyers this month will be the *CDC Emerger*.

This version of the *CDC Emerger* imitates a midge that is just beginning to emerge on the surface of the water. It should be used anytime trout are feeding on emerging midges or midge pupae. For midge hatches, vary the pattern and size to match the prevailing insects. Common body colors are black, gray, brown-olive, tan, and red. The pattern also

works well for hatches of small mayflies. With a brown or olive body and in sizes 18-20 it makes a dandy emerging blue-winged olive. With a pale yellow body in size 18, it will do well in a pale morning dun hatch.

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



#### **Lease Information**

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from any of the Club Officers or Board Members and are also available at the *Angler's Nook* (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the ATF fly shop in El Paso (915-225-0570.) Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

#### **Directions to the Lease:**

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
