Club Trip to the San Juan

The final plans for our annual fall San Juan outing have been firmly arranged for 7, 8 and 9 October 2005. It is expected that about 35 people will participate. The guided portion of the trip will be on 7 October (Friday). A current membership in the Mesilla Valley Flyfishers is required to participate in this outing, so please check your membership status in advance of the trip. A "Sign Up Sheet" will be established with a cutoff date of 1 October or when a total of 24 club members have registered. Registration will be on a first come first served basis. The member fee for a guide will be \$50.00 on a nonrefundable basis. This fee will cover a guide for 1/2 day with each guide having three clients. This is unchanged from the way things have been done for the past several years. If unable to attend after

Do You Remember the First Time?

Earl and Adan Arbogast

Editor's Note: Club member Earl Arbogast recently posted this story on Mike Mora's webpage and we thought that our members would like to read it also.

My 12 year old boy and I went fly fishing by ourselves for the first time today. We have been going to the Juan and Peñasco the past two years but always have had a guide. A friend of mine in Ruidoso showed me the river there and I let my son ditch school today and we headed out. Two hours later at 8:30AM we got there, walked to a spot at the river, and I started rigging up.

I had a guy give me three orange salmon egg flies and some grasshopper flies and I started with the egg. I had bought 7.5' leaders the night before and the first one didn't have a loop, and I didn't know how to tie one, so I laid that one on the ground. Should have rolled it up and put it away cause I forgot it. Then I pulled out a leader for a loop-to-loop connection and when I started to straighten the line, the end of the leader tangled around the zipper of my pack something terrible and I had to cut it about 2'. Lucky I had my tie fast knot tyer and I tied two nail knots and added 2' of tippet.

Great, I told my son to let me get the fly in the water and I got a strike the first time. On my backswing I snagged a tree and lost one of the salmon eggs. My son was laughing so hard he was crying. I started rigging up again and by the time I was through, my son told me it was 9 o'clock. I was at the symposium earlier in Albuquerque and good thing those guys - Jude Duran, Barel Fly, those two young tiers, and Mike Mora weren't watching, otherwise they would have voted me into the hall of shame in my first half hour of eligibility.

But after I got the fly in the water, we got two small rainbows on the egg, about 8". We learned something from our last guide called high sticking and that's about what we did at the river. We moved around and hit another good spot and got five strikes, my son got in three of those five in the net. One was about 12".

In between fish, we had a lot of mishaps. We would snag on wood in the river, high grass and more trees. I had bought some red chenille that was already round at Wal-Mart and I stuck those through the hooks and they produced our last five strikes. We had already lost the orange ones.

When I saw Mike Mora in Albuquerque with his two sons, I thought how lucky they must be to able to learn from him. But through me and my son's first flyfishing day, Mike has nothing on me. Although we snagged more trees and lost more flies than we caught fish, I had one of the most memorable and most fun days I have ever had with my son. Both our midsections our hurting from laughing so hard all day but we had a great time. - Earl & Adan

The Angler's Loop

This month we present another knot that is useful to the flyfisher. Also known as the "Perfection Loop," the Angler's Loop supposedly dates back at least to Izaak Walton. It is another knot which produces a small loop rather than drawing down tight against the eye of the hook. This allows the fly more freedom in the water and presents a more natural movement.

This knot is similar to the one presented here in April but is somewhat easier to tie.

To become proficient at tying this knot start by using 10 or 12 pound test line, take these instructions, sit quietly in a chair and practice. Be careful with hooks. You may consider cutting the point from a hook to practice with just to eliminate the chance of hooking yourself.



First tie an overhand knot in the line before passing the working end through the eye and back through the overhand knot to make a simple slip knot.



Adjust the loop to the desired size and tuck the end as shown.



Tighten the knot.
