Meeting Time Change

At the November Board meeting, members voted to change the start time of general membership meetings from 7:30pm to 7:00pm. The doors will be open at 6:30pm.

Dr. David Cawley - December Speaker

The general membership meeting will be held on 12 December at 7:00 PM. Dr. David Cawley will present a computer-aided talk on Fishes of the Rio Bonito, tributary of the Rio Yaqui, Mexico. He will discuss the results of field surveys of the fishes found in this large, intermittent headwater stream of the Rio Yagui in the rugged Sierra Madre mountain range of Sonora, Mexico. This study site is at the convergence of the Sonoran Desert with the Neotropics and it experiences very high magnitude variation across wet and dry seasons. The fragmentation of the Rio Bonito into discrete, smaller communities during dry season intermittency provides the opportunity to examine abiotic and biotic controls on the aquatic community during the extremes of the wet and dry seasons. It also provides a system to measure utilization of fish by terrestrial carnivores during the dry season.

Dr. Cowley has been doing research on native fishes in New Mexico, including the Rio Grande cutthroat trout and the Rio Grande silvery minnow. He has worked extensively with the Department of Game and Fish and the U. S. Forest Service on fisheries issues ranging from genetics, restoration strategies, and how to maintain viable hatchery programs for both native trouts and stocking programs. He is a fly fisherman and the faculty advisor for the NMSU Chapter of the American Fisheries Society. His Master's degree dealt with the distribution of fishes of the Black River, New Mexico. His doctoral and postdoctoral research concentrated on genetics. He has been teaching and doing research at NMSU since 2001.

Liars and Tiers

Liars and Tiers will not meet in December because of the busy schedules of the holidays. Instead "Tips for Beginning Fly Tiers" taken from the FFF webpage is offered and we will see you in January when the regular schedule is resumed.

Tips for Beginning Fly Tiers

- A stable vise, with good jaws to hold the hook firmly, provides the basic starting point for good fly tying.
- Always tie or wrap your thread in a motion over the top of the fly away from you.
- Sharpen all larger hooks (size 10 and up) before they are used to tie a fly.
- Before using a hook, check and make sure it is sharp and will not straighten out under pressure.
- A common problem with new fly tiers is breaking the thread. To get a feel for how tight to wrap your fly, intentionally apply force on the thread until it breaks.
- To avoid sloppy heads, do not tie too close to the hook eye.
- Tie carefully and correctly from the start. Speed will come with practice and repetition.

For dry flies:

- Avoid all unnecessary wraps of thread. Don't wrap three times when two will do.
- Use the lightest weight materials
- Use the least absorbent materials
- Choose the best quality hackle

Wet flies or nymphs should be constructed with materials as water-absorbent as possible
