Fish Stocked in Rio Peñasco

December 1st was fish stocking day at the Lease. Volunteers gathered early in the morning to meet the delivery truck and distribute the fish throughout the stream.

The bucket brigade distributed 500 rainbows and 100 browns in the stream starting at the upper boundary fence and continuing downstream as far as the waterfall below the lower bridge. The browns averaged about five inches long but the rainbows were from 8 inches to 13 inches. The larger ones weighed about a pound. Everyone should catch fish now

Also, two picnic tables were assembled and placed at each of the parking areas.

News from Trout Unlimited

Gila/Rio Grande Chapter

Note from the editor: since a majority of members of the G/RG chapter of TU are also members of MVFF, occasionally news items pertaining to the chapter will be included in this newsletter. Hopefully they will be of interest to members of both organizations.

Update on Gila Trout Stocking Efforts October 2012

One thousand Gila trout from the Mora National Fish Hatchery (MNFH) were stocked in Black Canyon in late October. Black Canyon is a recovery stream for Main Diamond lineage fish and was not affected by this years' Whitewater-Baldy fire. Three thousand Gila trout were stocked in the West Fork of the Gila River between the Gila Cliff Dwellings and the water falls

below White Creek cabin. This section is downstream of that portion of drainage that was renovated for Gila trout and will support a recreational fishery. The immediately adjacent areas of this section were not burned, however, this reach was affected by fire associated ash and sediment flows, which likely greatly diminished, if not eliminated, nonnative trout. The fish that were stocked in this lower section were originally intended for designated recovery reaches, but stocking them at this time was not feasible, and MNFH could not continue holding the fish. The Gila Trout Recovery Team will be meeting in early December, and we will notify members of current status and plans for efforts in 2013.

MVFF Board Meeting Minutes

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F Conference Room by President Chuck Mueller. In attendance were Chuck Mueller, Gary Mann, Ron Warnke, Bob Silver, George Sanders, Jeff Arteburn, Jim Sorenson, Paul Turner and Ron Bellerose and non-Board members, Tom Wobbe and Jim Hulsey.

- 1. Minutes of the October 2012 Board meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.
- The Treasurer reported that the Club has a balance of \$10,764 and \$1,825 has been spent for the annual raffle. The Treasurer's Report was accepted.
- 3. A motion was approved to authorize \$350 toward a rod building class with Bob Widgren as this year's President's gift.
- 4. The Club has 222 members (92 in Las Cruces) who have paid their dues for this year.
- 5. Ron Bellerose reported that a Project Healing Waters fly rod was left at the Lease. Anyone who finds the rod is asked to please return it. He has been working with a couple of local veterans, but otherwise PHW is quiet until next spring.
- 6. Ron Warnke reported \$79 in Club merchandise sales during the San Juan trip. He will make the

- merchandise available for purchase as Christmas gifts.
- Plans for the December 1st stocking and stream improvements at the Lease were finalized.
 Members will be asked to meet at 6:45am at the K-Mart parking lot to car pool to the Lease.
- 8. The current slate of directors will be nominated for election at the December general meeting.
- The request for the Club to provide a fly tying and casting demonstration in February at the Bosque State Park was approved.
- 10. A request for the Club to participate in the Mesilla Valley Outdoor Expo at a cost of \$600 was discussed. A motion to decline the request passed.
- Paul Turner agreed to inquire about the Club's scholarship fund balance with the NMSU Foundation.
- 12. The following 2013 Club trips have been scheduled:
 - Big Horn River, Montana June 18 to 22 Quinlen Ranch, NM July 17 to 20 San Juan River, NM October 10 to 13
- 13. The next Board meeting will be Monday, December 17, 2012 at 7:00pm.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40pm.

Product Review of Tear-Aid

How to Find Pinhole Leaks in Breathable Waders

Some days of the trip on Kodiak, Alaska this year the wind made casting for silver salmon tough. Weighted flies like Clouser Minnows became like bullets. We all bounced flies off ourselves more than once. I managed to

send a hook through my waders creating an 1/8-inch small tear and a couple of small pin holes in my knees. The tear was on my hip and a lot of cold Pasagshak River poured in so I had to get that one

patched. I never could really find the pinholes at my knee so I let them be until getting back home.

I found a product called Tear-Aid that is terrific for patching breathable waders and a technique for finding the pinholes. Tear-Aid comes in Type A for repairing fabrics like waders and Type B for repairing things made of vinyl. Mack's Sporting Goods in Kodiak only had Tear-Aid in Type B, but I was

desperate to fix the tear so I took a chance. I followed the instructions and centered a pre-cut patch over the tear. Right away I could tell this product might be really good. The adhesive was very tacky and the patch was made of a durable material that stretched. I noticed that Tear-Aid met several engineering and military specifications too.

In the motel that evening I rubbed the patch onto the waders. It looked like I could have used the waders immediately. In my tackle kit from home I had brought some Gore-Tex patches. So I put a patch on the Gore-Tex liner inside of the wader over the tear too. The next day not a drop of water came through the patch. The patch is still on the waders and it looks permanent even though it is the Type-B patch meant for vinyl products. I ordered the Type-A kit (shown) online from Dick's Sporting Goods and I used

that kit for the pinhole leaks. The box comes with a 2" x 12" patch that can be easily cut with scissors, 2-pre-cut patches, a couple of alcohol pre-pads and instructions. I've used the two-part mixes and things like Goop to patch waders before. In my opinion, they all take too long to cure or the tube is dry when you need it. Tear-Aid is great. The fix is instant. The patch can stretch without lifting. The adhesive is 90% strong to start and cures to 100% overnight. Even the backing of the adhesive patch is easy to peel off. I give Tear-Aid a Thumbs Up! Tear-Aid is more

like an industrial supplier, but I found this link with a product explanation intended for consumers

http://www.sailrite.com/Tear-Aid-Repair-Kit-Type-A.

Now let me tell you how I found the pinholes. You need some rubbing alcohol, a cotton ball and a permanent magic marker. If you have a pinhole leak you know the general area on the waders where it might be....so start

there. Turn the waders inside out where you suspect the pinhole to be. Wet the cotton ball with alcohol and rub the cotton ball over the suspect area. Almost immediately you will see a dark spot forming where the alcohol has penetrated the breathable liner and has soaked into the outside fabric. Take your marker and circle the spot. Now turn the waders right-side out and you should see the spot on the outside of the wader too. Circle it too. What surprised me is I found three pinholes in one area.....I guess I need to start casting better. Follow the instructions from Tear-Aid and stick a patch on the outside of the waders. I also used the Gore-Tex patch kit that I already had to put patches inside the waders too, but I think Tear-Aid would work for that as well. Real simple....that's it! Tight Lines,

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437), Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the Sportsman's Elite fly shop (915-587-4867) in El Paso. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
