The past couple of weeks were busy ones for the Club. Bob Silver and Jim Ellett made some stream improvements on the lower section of the lease in preparation for releasing trout. November

16th we had a fly tying clinic at NMSU for the Student Chapter of the American Fisheries Society. November 17th the lease was stocked with 700 trout with help of our members and students from NMSU. The students who helped with stocking trout were able to fish the upper section of the lease in the afternoon. From November 18th through the 23rd some of our members helped Ti Piper with his fishing clinic for special needs kids. November 22nd, Tom Wobbe, Julie Mueller and I went to Fort Bliss to receive a Certificate of Appreciation for our work with their soldiers through PHW. #### **Bio for Toner Mitchell**

Please join us for a special presentation by Toner Mitchell, noted fly fishing guide, author, and New Mexico's Public Lands Coordinator for Trout Unlimited. Toner has been a key figure in New Mexico fly fishing and conservation efforts for many years. He has been the Operations Manager for The Reel Life fly shop in Santa Fe since 2003, with a real commitment towards integrating the fly fishing industry into the conservation of our fisheries and recovery of native trout species. He has published numerous articles describing fly fishing locations in northern New Mexico, and is intimately familiar with the Rio Chama, Rio Grande, etc. You can check out his interesting and informative online conversation about fly fishing and outdoor life http://truchacabra.com/.

You can also read his article in the current November/December 2013 issue of Southwest Fly Fishing magazine that describes some of the conservation related initiatives in the Taos area such as the recent designation of Rio Grande del Norte National Monument, and ongoing efforts to further protect the headwaters of the Rio Hondo and Red River located in the Columbine Hondo Wilderness Study Area as a federally designated wilderness. Through his role in Trout Unlimited he is directly involved in researching means of providing in-stream winter water to key drainages in northern New Mexico such as the Chama, Cimarron, and Costilla, promoting outdoor education opportunities for all age groups in southern Rocky Mountains, working towards passage of Public Lands Renewable Energy Development Act, facilitating development and transmission renewable energy, and working towards

the transfer of the Valles Caldera National Preserve from the Forest Service to Park Service in the interest of better wildlife management and greater sportsman access to wildlife. Please join us for a stimulating presentation and discussion with Toner Mitchell. The doors will open at 6:30pm in the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish Conference Room, 2715 Northrise Drive, Las Cruces, NM 88011.

## **Bio for Van Beacham**

Van Beacham, author of the Flyfisher's Guide to New Mexico, will be our guest speaker at the 2014 MVFF Annual Banquet and Raffle that will held on January 18, 2014.

Van Beacham is a fourth generation native New Mexican and descends from a long line of over six generations of fly fishermen. He was born in Santa Fe and began fishing with his father and grandfather when he was four years old.

Van is a very well known guide in New Mexico, Colorado and Wyoming. He is the owner of The Solitary Angler in Taos, New Mexico. Van has guided anglers of all levels from New Mexico to Wyoming since 1978.



At 9:30am on Saturday, January 18th Van will hold a casting class at the Alumni Pond next to the Pan Am Center on the New Mexico State University campus.

Then that evening, he will be our guest speaker after dinner at the Banquet. He is well known for finding special out-of-the way fishing locations that are less known and crowded; hence the name, *Solitary Angler*.

He will talk about some of the quality waters that he has fished and how each of us can go about finding similar fishing spots in Northern New Mexico and Southern Colorado.

Van has donated a guided fishing trip for two and he will also have some of his books available to autograph for purchase. Come hear a very special talk about the knowledge, skills and favorite locations that Van will share with you.

# "BIG" Steam Improvement and Stocking

The river is in the best shape that it has been in a long time and now would be a good time to fish. If you spent any time fishing the lease in the past you know that the bottom in places is extremely hard. Over the years we have tried

number of stream any improvement techniques. But the hard-pan bottom, especially just above and below the lower bridge, has always proven to be a major impediment to anything we have tried. In fact, I concluded the river must have scoured itself down to bedrock.

This summer Jim Ellett bought a large front end loader and so another attempt to improve the holding water for the fish was launched. I wrote about it in the last newsletter. We spent several weekends finding LARGE rocks in the hills above the river that

we put into the river knowing full well that "Mother Nature" could easily undo our work. It didn't take her long. In September there was a lot of rain in the Sacramento Mountains and sure enough, one particularly large storm undid our summer rock work. One rock in particular is about 7 feet in diameter and about 18 inches thick. We placed

it just below the Lower Bridge. It was moved more than 100 yards downstream and put on the bank.

In October we decided to put the rocks that we could find back into the river. We started at the Cottonwood tree just below the Lower Bridge. On a whim, I asked Jim if he could try digging into the river bottom, but I didn't expect to have much success. To our surprise the machine was able to break through the hard pan and it dug up a full bucket load of gravel. Eureka! Over the past couple of weeks Jim created many new runs, riffles and holes from just above the waterfall to as far up the river as you can see in the picture below taken just above the Lower Bridge. The piles of gravel you see were dug from the bottom and each represents a new pool and run that are several feet deep. The work covers about ½ mile of river that before was a marginal stretch of water often only 6 inches deep. Now there are many new

places for fish to hold and I place as well.

am excited that we may have a solution to the hard pan bottom. Trout have spawned in the river and now there is so much more loose gravel that maybe we will have more natural reproduction taking

Many thanks to Jim Ellett for use of the front end loader and his time. Tom Wobbe and I had a great time playing in the water and supervising. There is still some work to do by the downstream landowner to redo the irrigation takeout. We think that will

> occur around January. All of our work was completed before we stocked fish on November 17th. About 700 fish were stocked. Most are in the 6 to 8 inch range, but we also put in some bigger fish, 12 to 14 inches, too. On November 21st we put in another 300 fish so the whole length of the river has been stocked. In addition, I

caught some carryover fish that survived the flood in September and these fish were 14 to 16 inches.

We had a great turnout for the stocking from Club members as far away as Odessa, TX and from students in the Fisheries Program at New Mexico State University. We want to thank everyone for their time.

Explore the new river. I know you will like what you find. Remember, these are winter time conditions so fish deep unless you see fish chasing emerging flies. Go Fish! Rob

## **MVFF Board Meeting Minutes**

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F Conference Room by President Chuck Mueller. In attendance were Chuck Mueller, Jeff Arterburn, Ron Warnke, Jim Sorenson, Bob Silver and Ron Bellerose and non-Board members Tom Wobbe, Dave Medler, Ray Rodriguez, Hunter Falco and Dominique Lujan.

- 1. Minutes of the October 2013 Board meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.
- 2. In the Treasurer's absence, Tom Wobbe reported that the Club has a balance of approximately \$9.800.
- 3. The Club has 222 paid-up members.
- 4. Ron Bellerose reported that PHW has \$138 in the Club's treasury and \$1,000 from PHW. He is taking five or six veterans to the San Juan to fish on Thursday. The Cloudcroft Chapter of Wounded Warriors has asked PHW to provide a fly fishing clinic for its members on the weekend before Memorial Day 2014. About 20 veterans are expected to participate. PHW will also have a fly tying clinic on Thursday, November 27 at 1:00pm at the Veteran's Affairs Clinic on Don Roser.
- 5. Toner Mitchell will hold a casting clinic on December 8<sup>th</sup> at 2:00pm on rigging and casting streamers at NMSU Alumni Pond and will speak at the December 9<sup>th</sup> meeting regarding fly fishing in Northern New Mexico and the Trout Unlimited Project on the Red River.
- 6. Hunter Falco, President, and Dominique Lujan, Vice-President, of the NMSU Chapter of the American Fisheries Society were present to thank MVFF for the fly tying and casting clinic for their Chapter on November 16th and the trip to the

- Lease on November 17th. MVFF will host their Chapter members at the Lease on December 7th. An invitation to attend the MVFF annual banquet in January was also extended to their members.
- 7. Tom Wobbe reported that the Club stocked the lower Rio Peñasco at the Lease with 700 rainbow trout on November 17th. A motion authorizing Tom to purchase an additional 300 fish to stock the upper part on December 7th was approved.
- 8. Ray Rodriguez, Dave Medler and Dennis Lanpher have agreed to be nominated for election to the Board at the December meeting. Ron Warnke and Ron Bellerose have asked not to be nominated for another term. A motion to invite a member of the NMSU Chapter of the American Fisheries Society to serve as a member of the MVFF Board was approved.
- A motion to sell permits to NMSU students for \$15, provided that the student is a member of the Club, was approved. The Club will waive receipt of its portion of the permit price.
- 10. Final preparation for the Club's annual banquet and raffle was discussed. Van Beacham has agreed to be the keynote speaker and will provide a casting clinic at the NMSU Alumni Pond on January 18th from 9:30am to 11:30am. The January Board meeting will be moved to Monday, January 13th.
- Jeff reported that the Trout Unlimited National meeting will be held in Santa Fe in September 2014.
- 12. The next Board meeting will be Monday, December 16, 2013 at 7:00pm.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm.

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



#### **Lease Information**

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437) and Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

#### **Directions to the Lease:**

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
