This time we need a large group of volunteers to help complete the remainder of the project. To carpool, please plan to meet at the K-Mart on highway 70 at 7:30 AM. Camping at the lease is also allowed. It will be helpful to bring leather gloves, hip boots, sledge hammers, a lunch and something to drink. We will have the raw materials ready and the work will go quickly if we have plenty of help. Remember, everyone that comes to the project will be given a chance to win a rod. Fly of the Month

Bite Me Bugger

Description

This pattern was developed by Mark Boname, a guide on the North Platte in central Wyoming. It's a guides' favorite among those who float below Grey Reef. The pattern has been a good producer of both trout and panfish for me in ponds. A very versatile pattern because it imitates a lot of different things from baitfish, to leeches, to a daphnia cluster. **more flies**.

HOOK: 4X long, size 6, streamer hook

BEAD: Bronze cone-head

THREAD: Brown

TAIL: Brown marabou with red krystal flash

UNDERBODY: Brown chenille - small **BODY**: Canadian brown mohair



Tying Instructions

- 1. Slide on the conehead. You can glue the conehead to the hook, but it is not necessary. To glue the conehead hang the hooks from the bend after putting on the cone-head, then fill hollow back of the cone-head with epoxy and allow to cure. Zap A Gap works well too.
- 2. Tie in tail with 3 or 4 strands of krystal flash on each side.
- 3. Tie in the chenille and mohair at front of tail
- 4. Wrap chenille in touching turns up to rear of the cone- head and secure with thread.
- 5. Wrap mohair forward in opposite direction from that used with the chenille. Brush fibers toward rear with fingers after each wrap, and tie off at rear of cone-head.
