Rio Peñasco Work Parties 11 February & 18 March

The Club has two work sessions planned for the lease on the Rio Peñasco. On February 11 we will clean out some of the willows on the upper end of the lease to make the water easier to fish. If you have fished this stretch before you know that the fishing can be difficult and many flies will probably be lost. Bring chain saws, machetes, pruners and any other tools which can be used to thin the brush. March 18 will be devoted to planting trees. This will be on the lower part of the Lease which, unlike the upper stretch, doesn't have enough trees to reduce erosion and provide shade. Again bring whatever tools you think will be appropriate.
