We are continuing to receive good fishing reports from those who have fished the Penasco Lease. Even with lower water conditions the fish are continuing to be in good condition and hitting quite well on top and nymphs. Permits are available from Donna Mabie, Jim Hulsey or Tom Wobbe. Just give any one of us a call and pick up a permit or let us mail it to you.

The San Juan trip proved to be a good time for those who were able to attend. The flow was cut to 500 cfs and has remained there until Tuesday, June 27 when it was raised to over 700 cfs to provide more water downstream for the endangered species. There was plenty of food at the potluck and a good time was enjoyed by everyone, with about 17 attending. Fishing was great with several reports of 15-20+ trout daily. It seems that Brown's are showing up in Texas Hole and above, with Texas Hole running about 40-50% Brown Trout.

Rio Peñasco Fishing Report

Editor's Note: Tim Mack of El Paso recently fished the Lease on the Rio Peñasco and filed the following report.

We arrived around 10:30 AM and were greeted by the ranch owner. He was very friendly. We walked down to the bridge and two of us went down and the rest went up stream. I went up stream. Casting was tough but I hooked a few and lost them. They were hitting on a size 16 pheasant tail nymph. I finally caught two rainbows, they were 8- and 10-inches long. The two that went down stream came up and passed the rest of us. I worked the stream up to a large slow moving pool where I found the guys trying to catch these rainbows that were feeding on top. The pool was large enough that all four of us could fish it. I noticed a lot of ants around and tied on a foam ant. In two casts I caught a good size rainbow (approx. 15 inches) on the ant. He came up and nailed it! We took a picture and I will send it to you as soon as I get it from Bill. We all started using ants. They seemed to be hitting them all over. I caught two more and worked my way downstream.

We met under the bridge for lunch. I was fishing while Bill went for the food. I worked the pool right

under the bridge with the foam ant and a copper john for a dropper. I hooked up with a brown trout, he hit the copper john. Bill's son-in-law helped me land it. It was about 11 inches. We broke for lunch. After lunch we all worked the stream below the bridge. I caught another brown on the same copper john. The only two browns caught through out the day. Bill took a picture of this fish. I will also send it when I get it.

On the lower end, I switched to a stimulator size 14. I caught a bunch of rainbows on it. They were all around 12 inches. We were having too much fun. At the end of the day we switched to small flies because there were tricos hatching. We caught a few on griffin's gnats size 22. It was a good day.

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Zugbug

The center of attention for the Liars and Tiers this month will be the *Zugbug*. It was originally designed by J.Cliff Zug and is thought to be a variation of a nymph called the Kemp bug. It is one of those must have flies and rates along with Pheasant Tail nymphs, Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear nymphs and Prince's nymph as one of the top 10 nymphs that you must have in your fly box. It is the use of the green peacock herl with it's efflorescent qualities that makes it so alluring and successful. Detailed step-by-step tying instructions can be found at <u>flyanglersonline.com</u> Fished in the same manner as the Hare's Ear Nymph, the Zug Bug generally imitates food items like mayfly and damselfly nymphs, caddis pupae, etc. It can also be used as a stonefly imitation. This fly could also be tied as a beadhead.



Hook: Daiichi 1710, sizes 6 - 16. Thread: Black or olive. Weight: Med. or small lead wire (if desired). Tail: Peacock herl. Wingcase: Woodduck flank or turkey quill, clipped short. Body: Peacock herl. Ribbing: Oval silver tinsel. Hackle: Furnace, sparse, tied beard-style.

Gunnison/Taylor Rivers Fishing Report

Editor's Note: Club member Barry Prahl and daughter Courtney recently (18-22 June) took a fishing trip to Colorado and filed this fishing report.

I had to be dragged off the river, the fishing was incredible. My daughter and I fished the Taylor River pocket waters around Almont, CO. Every evening there was a wall of caddis so thick that I'd never seen anything like it.

The evening hatch made the river boil with hungry trout. We caught 15-20 fourteen- to sixteen-inch browns and bows almost every night. I fished the Gunnison River down by Cooper's Ranch on Wednesday and Thursday between 11 and 2pm. There were green drakes coming off on Wednesday and I caught more than half dozen healthy browns and bows.

Thursday I went back for more. The sun stayed out and there was a caddis hatch between 11:30am and

1:30pm. I caught twenty three trout on a tan elk hair caddis (18 size.) My daughter and I took a guided float trip on Monday and did ok. It was a learning experience for her, fishing from a raft and on a big river. She did great and I'm sure proud of her. All in all GUNNISON is fishing really well. We hadn't been there in about three years. Now that the whirling disease has been handled, the rainbows are coming back nicely. All of the browns in the rivers are native. I would highly recommend a trip to Colorado to get away from the heat here and go where there is water everywhere. (PS. Mount Crested Butte was still pretty much covered in snow.) Enjoy your next fishing trip.


Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters can be obtained from any of the Club Officers or Board Members and are also available at the *Angler's Nook*. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (505-687-

3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$20.00 per day with student permits (ages 12 through 17) costing only \$12.00 per day. Kids under 12 fish free. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
