President's Corner

Put July 9 and 10 on your calendar for the Club trip to the Conejos River in southern Colorado. The Conejos has about 45 miles of fishing available from a

meandering river in wide open meadows to boulderstrewn pocket water. Early to mid July is a good time to fish dry flies and there is a very good chance to fish during the Green Drake hatch. The Green Drake is a large (size 12) mayfly famous with fishermen on most of the western rivers. There still might be some giant stoneflies hatching as well. In addition, the Rio de los Pinos where the Cumbres & Toltec narrow gauge trains stops for lunch, and the Chama river are also not far away. Last year the Conejos was muddled by strong thundershowers. We fished the Los Pinos instead and walked up stream on the railroad tracks. The river was perfectly clear plus we had the bonus of seeing the train come by with its steam whistle blowing. And, there is a "secret" small stream with Rio Grande cutthroats nearby as well. By the way, this would be a perfect trip for those in the mentoring program. I am planning to camp July 8, 9 and 10 at the Mogote Campground. The campground is about 12 miles west of Antonito, CO on Highway 17. I will post driving directions and places to stay on the MVFF webpage. If you are planning to go, but don't want to camp, a cabin at the Conejos River Anglers is a really great place to stay. They are located at 34591 State Highway 17 just about 5 miles west of Antonito, CO. The telephone number is (719) 376-5660. Call soon because it is a popular place with fishermen.

We had about 10 people in our first mentorship program class on May 29th. Colleen Caldwell did a great job covering stream entomology and trout biology. The rest of the class was devoted to tackle

Usage of Club Funds

A few years ago the Club discontinued the mailing of newsletters and instead started posting them on the MVFF web site. Since that time the balance of funds in the bank account has continued to increase. This increase is also helped somewhat by the fees collected for fishing permits for the Lease. For those who don't know, 60% of the fees collected for permits go the land owners as trespass fees with the remainder going to the Club. We use most of our part for stream improvements and stocking.

The Club has its annual fund raising raffle in January along with the annual banquet. Because of the nice prizes offered for the raffle and since the banquet is no cost to the attendees, not only does the Club not make money but actually loses a few hundred each year.

In spite of the expenditures our bank balance is almost *13,000 (May report) and the Board has been discussing ways of using some of these funds for the benefit of the members. Some of the items suggested were:

- Stream improvements for the Lease. There are probably several things that could be done to make it more fishable and to increase the trout carrying capacity. Probably, any of these would require land owner approval.
- A small bunk house at the lease for overnight use by members. A small pre-fab building could be moved to the Lease with carpentry skilled members fixing it up with bunks cabinets, furniture, etc. This, obviously would require permission from the ranch owner.
- A picnic table at the lease; A picnic table could be placed at the lower bridge under the large tree there. A porta-potty is already located nearby. This would also require land owner permission.
- Guest speakers; Perhaps members would like to see more big name flyfishing personalities brought in to speak and conduct workshops such as Scott Sanchez did a couple of years ago.
- Better door prizes at monthly meetings (\$50 gift card); This would only help local members that can attend meetings but would reward them for participating.

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- Casting classes for members; This is almost a given. Bob Widgren, a FFF certified casting instructor, came down from Albuquerque a couple of times this last year to conduct classes and would certainly be available in the future. Expenses for this is minimal.
- Expense reimbursement for mentors. Pay the out-of-pocket expenses for members involved with the mentoring program the Club is trying to get started. Maybe this would help get more members to take neophyte fisherman to the Lease and give them a few pointers.

These are just a few of the things that might be done to make the Club more fulfilling of member needs and to make it more new-member friendly. I'm sure there are many more worthy of consideration. If you have other suggestions the Board wants to hear them. After all this is your club, participate.

When Wind Knots Really Are Wind Knots

(Or, a trip to the lease on 5/2/10) David Carmichael

After hearing how well the Awesome Lady Anglers did on the lease the week before, we decided to make a family trip to the Rio Peñasco to usher in the month of May. When we arrived on the lease shortly after

11am, conditions were already fairly intimidating. The skies were mostly clear, air temperature was 55 degrees and the water conditions were normal and clear, but the winds were already whipping at 20-30 mph. By midafternoon they were getting up to 30-40 mph, and storm clouds moved in from the southwest. The fish were biting all day, but as you

can imagine, line control was very challenging and we had problems putting the flies in front of the fish and making any sort of natural drift. The willows were



of fluorocarbon that we value for presenting dead drifts also makes it more prone to wind knots and bird nests. It was one of those days that Landon Mayer writes/speaks about... where you

beginning to bloom, making them all the more likely

to snare our tippets. And it seems that the limpness

pay your dues on the water and hopefully learn a few things in the process. One of those days that make you feel good later for having stuck it out, but which are pretty grim while you're in the midst of battling the elements. Like fishing the Juan in a snowstorm and 30

degree temperatures.

There was a substantial *baetis* hatch in the early afternoon, about 2pm, but the wind was so fierce the

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mayflies couldn't get off the water. They were immediately flattened against the surface, and it looked like a heavy spinner fall, with flattened, soaked mayflies swirling around in the eddies. But

the trout didn't seem much interested in the surface possibilities during the high winds. Miriam's largest fish (15") was caught on a size 8 wooly bugger, but most of our fish were caught on nymphs, either an RS2 or flashback pheasant tail, in sizes 14 or 16. As we were about to pack up and head home about 5pm, the winds died down, the

storm arrived with a light drizzle, and the fishing really turned on. There was another small-sized *baetis* hatch, something like size 20 or 22, along with a midge hatch, and the trout were literally churning the water in some runs, feeding mainly on emergers. Miriam, Clayton and I combined for a total of 42 fish, several in the 15-16" class, and most of them caught in the last 1 ½ hours of the day. Miriam caught two nice trout on a parachute Adams; it is encouraging that dries are beginning to be effective, as the



healthy, thick aquatic plant growth is already making nymphing and landing fish challenging in some runs.

We often see interesting wildlife behavior when

visiting the lease, and this day was no exception. We watched as a male western tanager perched on a twig over the water and picked off emerging aquatic insects before they could escape the surface. I also "caught" a tree swallow, a fly fishing first for me. It wasn't actually hooked, but got tangled in my leader while I was casting. The bird sat quietly in my hand

as I freed it from the fluorocarbon, and after I smoothed its feathers it flew off to join the others feeding on the "happy hour" hatch. We were off the river and headed home by 7pm, when the full force of the storm hit. Before we made it to Cloudcroft, the temperature had dropped to 30 degrees, it was snowing, and there were several inches accumulated on the ground. What a wild, awesome, beautiful day!

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437), Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the Sportsman's Elite fly shop (915-587-4867) in El Paso. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
