# LADY ANGLERS "TACKLE" PEÑASCO

It was a weekend of friends, fun and fish for the Lady Anglers on April 24 and 25 when we started our fishing season at the club lease waters of the Peñasco River. Nine anglers met at Orr Canyon Ranch near Cloudcroft on Friday evening for wine, dinner and fishing predictions

for the days ahead. Our stalwart heroines were undaunted by the fact that at the time it was snowing so hard that you could not see across the street.

By morning the snow had ceased, the sun was out and hopes were high. We met our knowledgable and skilled (early rising) guides, Bob Silver, Jeff Arterburn and George Sanders on the river by 8:30. Three anglers fished the upper river and found it challenging with it's narrow channels and low hanging branches. Patience paid off, even if flies were lost, as all three caught fine fat rainbows in the deep pools and along edges of the riffles. Most were caught on secret flies that our guide tied! (Don't ask for details, our lips are sealed.) They were his own special recipes which are variations of bead-head pheasant tails (#16 & 18--but they seemed a lot smaller...) and BWO emergers. Mary Hoffman got the fish of the day when she hooked a nice big brown; the first seen by our guides on the river in a very long time!

Two groups fished the middle and lower sections of the river with success. We found that for the most part, the fish went for the #16 and 18 nymphs in the earlier part of the day and smaller (#18 and 20) emerger patterns after it warmed up. Everyone met for a mid-day picnic and we then switched to different sections of the river in the afternoon. As the day warmed up, the fish got much more active and we

all found our own favorite spots which we planned to fish the next day.

We are fortunate to have in our group a fisheries scientist, Prof. Colleen Caldwell. Her expertise provided an interesting addition to the activities. During the mid-day break, she shared with us information about a collection of live insects she had just taken from the river. We were able to see the "naturals" that we were modeling our flies from. Later in the afternoon she showed us a collection that compared the various morphologies. She was able to answer lots of questions about what we had seen on the river. This added a lot to our appreciation for the habitat and our understanding of flyfishing.

Saturday evening was a time for more wine, an excellent dinner at the Lodge at Cloudcroft and many fish stories. On Sunday we tried our wings, fishing on our own. It was a very productive day and everyone finished satisfied with good catches of fairly active fish. We met for a final picnic lunch and we were already looking forward to coming back next year at the same time. We all think that this should be an annual event!

## **MVFF Board Meeting Minutes**


Monday, April 19, 2010 Submitted by Jim Sorenson, Secretary

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F conference room by President Bob Silver. In attendance were Bob Silver, Chuck Mueller, Jim Sorenson, Paul Turner, George Sanders, Gary Mann, George Thomas and non-Board members Jim Hulsey, Tom Wobbe and Ron Bellerose.

- 1. Minutes of the March Board meeting were approved as published in the April newsletter.
- 2. The Treasurer's report was approved. The Club has a balance of \$11,770 and the Mabie Scholarship fund has a book value of \$11,003.
- 3. Tom Wobbe reported there are 251 current members.
- Ron Bellerose presented the quarterly report on Project Healing Waters. Club members have provided a total of 432 volunteer hours and 2,385 miles driven.
- Because of other commitments, we will decline the invitation to participate in the Las Cruces Shooting Fair on April 24<sup>th</sup> at Butterfield Range.
- The Kids' Fishing Clinic was held on Saturday, April 17. Nearly 80 kids and 120 parents attended the event.
- 7. The Club will support the NM Game & Fish "Free Fishing Day" on June 5 at Alumni Pond and Lake Roberts.
- 8. Paul Turner reported that there is \$824 available for conservation improvements to the lease.

- Bob Silver circulated a list of Committee members.
- 10. A motion to use one of the purchased rods for a "Rod for Christmas" raffle was approved. The raffle will begin with the general meeting in May and the winner announced at the December meeting.
- 11. Club fishing trips were approved as follows:
- Muskie fishing at Quemado Lake in mid-June
- Conejos River beginning July 12th
- San Juan River on October 1-3. John Tavenner will be asked to furnish two guides.
- 12. The date for the next annual meeting was set for January 22, 2011. John Bailey will be the guest speaker. We will ask him to make a technical presentation on a topic of his choice earlier that day.
- 13. A motion to begin a Mentoring Program was approved to consist of:
- Written handouts about equipment, rigging, fishing techniques, casting, etc.
- Two to three classes on knots, tackle and equipment, basic entomology, etc.
- Trips to the lease with a mentor.
- The Club will furnish the mentor's permit for the lease for that day.
- Mentors will be solicited at the next meeting.
   The meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm.

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



#### **Lease Information**

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437), Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the Sportsman's Elite fly shop (915-587-4867) in El Paso. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

#### **Directions to the Lease:**

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
