

# **President's Corner**



The northern New Mexico mountains have gotten some snow in the last several months and the prospects for summer fishing are looking good. The year-to-date averages for the major river

basins are:

- Rio Chama 86%
- Upper Rio Grande 73%
- Jemez 90%
- San Juan 71%
- Pecos
- Sangre de Cristo 103%

• Cimarron 107%

The National Weather Service is forecasting better than average precipitation for the next several months. The Gila, unfortunately, is still well below average and the Gila National Forest personnel report that most of the rivers and streams are still unfishable as a result of the recent forest fires and subsequent floods.

A big thank you goes to Bob Silver and Tom Wobbe for organizing a work day at the Lease. The river, from the big arroyo downstream to below the lower waterfall, had become clogged with algae. A couple of groups of volunteers have raked out as much of the algae as possible. It should be a big improvement for the Project Healing Waters group on April 8<sup>th</sup> and the Lady Anglers on April 18<sup>th</sup>.

Speaking of stream improvements on the Lease, two groups of NMSU students will be surveying the Rio

Peñasco at the Lease, measuring stream flows, fish and aquatic insects and writing proposals to improve the quality of the fish habitat as a class project. The students will be at the Lease on April 11 and 12 and we expect to have the proposals by mid-May. As early as the May meeting, the board will begin reviewing the proposals and establishing a budget to incorporate as many of the stream improvements as possible.

In that regard, Mark Lenarz has donated a new, custom made bamboo fly rod for the Spring Rod Raffle. Raffle tickets are \$20 each and no more than 50 tickets will be sold with the drawing to be held at the Club's general meeting on May 11<sup>th</sup>. All of the raffle proceeds have been dedicated to stream improvements at the Lease. So, even if you don't win the rod, you are investing in an improved fishing experience for all of us. Either way, you win.

Don't forget the annual Kids' Fishing Clinic on April 4<sup>th</sup>. The Club has organized and sponsored this community project for many years. We expect 120+ kids and their parents at the event, so we can use all the volunteers who can come.

Finally, recent fishing reports from the Lease have been very good in spite of the algae. With all of the mild weather, there couldn't be a better time to get out and fish.

Project Healing Waters is doing great. The 1<sup>st</sup> quarter report is as follows: new Vets-9, total Vets-86, Vet hours-247, volunteers-36, volunteer

hours=115, fly tying-9, casting-2, fishing-5 and rod building-7.

#### **MVFF Board Meeting Minutes**

Monday, March 16, 2015 Submitted by Jim Sorenson, acting secretary

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F Conference Room by President Jim Sorenson. In attendance were Jim Sorenson, Chuck Mueller, Bob Silver, Jeff Arterburn, Gary Mann, Dennis Lanpher and non-Board members Tom Wobbe, Ron Bellerose and Jim Hulsey.

- 1. Minutes of the February 2015 Board meeting were approved as published in the March newsletter.
- 2. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$12,729. The Treasurer's report was accepted.
- 3. Tom Wobbe reported that the Club has 242 paidup members—89 in Las Cruces, 48 in El Paso, 16 in Lubbock and the remainder are scattered.
- Ron Bellerose reported that PHW will host the Ft. Bliss soldiers for fly tying and casting clinics on April 1 and for fishing at the Lease on April 8<sup>th</sup>.
- 5. Gila/Rio Grande Chapter and MVFF will hold a joint film fest at Ardevino's Restaurant in Sunland Park. The tentative date is June 14.
- 6. The Lincoln National Forest will hold a public meeting regarding the process for revising its

existing Forest Plan in Las Cruces on March 28, 2015 from 9:00am to noon at the Small Business Development Center, 2345 East Nevada.

- The Kids' Fishing Clinic is set for April 4<sup>th</sup>. A motion was approved for Tom Wobbe to spend \$500 for prizes, pizza, etc. in connection with the event.
- 8. The Club will invite Bill Edrington of Royal Gorge Anglers, Canon City, CO to be a guest speaker in the fall.
- 9. To date, 18 tickets for the Spring Rod Raffle have been sold.
- The April General meeting will be moved to April 20th because NMDG&F needs the room on April 13th.
- 11. Gary Mann will look into the cost of renting a van for regular monthly trips by club members to the lease.

Michael and I fished the downstream section approximately ¼ of a mile from the waterfall. Despite water levels being low there was a deep pool (2–3 feet) opposite a rocky outcrop. 19 fish were caught ranging from about 4 inches to 16 inches. Flies used:

- 1. Pheasant Tail Nymph size 16 (6 fish)
- 2. Hare's Ear Nymph size 18 (8 fish)
- 3. Foam Parachute Trico size 22 (5 fish)
- 4. Parachute Adams size 14 (0 fish)
- 5. Olive Woolly Bugger size 10 (0 fish)

6. Olive Blue Flash Damsel Nymph size 12 (0 fish) Nymphs were fished with Pheasant Tail Nymph 3.5 feet below indicator with the Hare's Ear Nymph as a dropper 14 inches below on 5x tippet. The Parachute Adam's was fished on a 9-foot 4x tapered leader with the Parachute Trico 16 inches below on 5x tippet. Notes:

- Had numerous refusals on the Parachute Adams.
- River will be used for irrigation in the near future.
  Mr. Ellett suggests that the water level will drop another 2 feet.

# Fishing Report #2

Blaine Goss (3/19/15) Drove up yesterday. Water was clear. Caught 7 trout. One was 17" Others were 10-12" Caught the bigger fish at the upper end. The lower end is still very mossy. Water was high but not torrential. It is hard to fish the mossy stuff. I tried dry flies to see if I could get a rise out of the mossy—no luck. We need a decent blow out to clear out the stuff.

- 1. 2 Scott rods: E2 905/4 These rods are used, but well cared for. Miriam and I have caught many fish with them. Discontinued model, original retail price was \$525, so they are mid-range rods. Asking \$100 each.
- 2. 2 Fly Logic rods: Fly Logic rods are mid-range, very good quality rods made in Melba, ID. I was introduced to them by a guide in Kodiak, Alaska who uses them for salmon, Dolly Varden and trout. These rods are very slightly used and in great condition. The FLP+ designates their mid-level rod (retail \$295), and the FLO+ is their highest level rod (retail \$535). They were purchased for a trip to Alaska that has not happened yet, so someone else might as well get some use from them. (I have caught Northern Pike on the 8wt in the Rio Grande near Taos)

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



### Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575–524–1880), Tom Wobbe (575–522–5437) and Donna Mabie (575–522–3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575–687–3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one–day, one–time permit for guests.

#### Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
