President's Corner

For my first article I thought I would introduce myself to our new members and even some old-timers who may not know me too well yet. I retired 3 years ago from New Mexico State University after 30 years of teaching and aquatic research with the Department of Fishery and Wildlife Sciences. I remain in touch with NMSU faculty and students and am on Stephanie Coleman's Masters Committee. Ms. Coleman was our 2006 MVFF scholarship recipient and gave an excellent talk on the status of the Gila trout and her thesis research at our October general meeting. My wife, Kay, is a novice flyfisher, but won't be able to join us on many club outings until she retires from her teaching position with the Gadsden School District. My son, Clinton, took fly-tying lessons from Norm Mabie and has loaned me his equipment and materials so I can start tying later this spring. He and I took a 10-day trip to Alaska last July for a week at an old friend's fishing lodge (DocWarners.com) and then took a 3-day kayak trip up the coast from Juneau with another friend and his two sons. We stayed at a primitive cabin that was only 2 miles from the mouth of a stream with a fresh run of pink and chum salmon, so I can honestly say I caught and released more 4 to 8-pound salmon on my flyrod than I bothered to count.

I grew up in the Missouri Ozarks and spent many days spin fishing for smallmouth bass from my canoe and by wade fishing. Thus, I am not truly a fly-fishing purist and will use other hook-and-line gear when the circumstances require. Because of my fisheries research experience and 31-year tenure on the Gila Trout Recovery Team, I know many of the headwater streams of the Gila and Aldo Leopold wilderness areas

and enjoy backpacking into remote streams. I also plan to make another float trip down the 42-mile wilderness stretch of the Gila River this spring, assuming the snowpack holds up and the river cooperates. Adams

The center of attention for the Liars and Tiers this month will be the *Adams*.

If ever there was a dry fly that needed no introduction, it is the *Adams* fly. This American fly pattern (designed by Len Halladay of Michigan in 1922 at the request of his close friend Charles Adams) was believed to have originally been a down wing pattern that more closely imitated a caddis. Regardless of it origins, the *Adams* dry fly is considered by many anglers to be the best dry fly

pattern ever conceived. There are many variations tied which include parachutes, egg-bearing females, trailing-shuck emergers, thorax ties, CDC-hackled Adams...even Adams wet flies! There are countless others, especially when you consider that the gray muskrat body color is often switched to imitate other species of mayflies and caddis!

Hook: Tiemco 100 size #10-#20 (or any

standard dry fly hook)
Thread: Gray or black 8/0
Wing: Grizzly hackle tips (hen)

Tail: Hackle fibers - grizzly/brown/grizzly

Abdomen: Muskrat underfur

Hackle: Grizzly and Brown (rooster/neck)

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from any of the Club Officers or Board Members and are also available at the *Angler's Nook*. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (505-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$20.00 per day with student permits (ages 12 through 17) costing only \$12.00 per day. Kids under 12 fish free. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
