Tim Mack gave the following report for the fly: "New fly I have been working on this past year. It worked well on the San Juan and the lease."




Hook: TMC 200R #18 to #22

mountains together, he said


"Now I know why you love to flyfish dad"

weather = overcast then later moderate snow with 5 inch accumulation in about an hour

hatches = none observed

details = Had free afternoon so I tried Las Huertas Creek, after years of interest...

The life zones change rapidly from the west face of the Sandias, with sagebrush and four wing salt bush to Pinon/Juniper to Aspen, White Fir and willows crowding the now flowing stream.

Parked on FS rd165, looked over first few pools. Put on gold bead nymph, about size 14, cast down into a travertine encrusted waterfall... immediate bite!! Played a couple more times with a dark colored rainbow of about 9"...tried a few more pools as the snow came in...crawled on hand and knee to a hidden

gem of a pool, the kind Rex Johnson always finds in the Gila, or Chiricahuas...completely hidden by willows, wild rose...a three foot deep pool, formed by a fall over calcium carbonate encrusted log. . Using same fly, it first wrapped around seemingly every willow, aspen and rose branch suspended above the stream. .The snow began to stick, but I persevered! ...unwrapped line, and crawled closer, plopped the line in and a slight bite!! . Once more and now surprisingly furious pulling...saw another dark trout, and it appeared to have swallowed the fly... Too small to think it could survive cutting the leader...and this is NOT a native cutthroat or Gila...Breakfast!!! (There is a place for having wild trout from planted "parents"... The snow came harder and I now was aware the reports of "Huertas being a trout stream were correct,...oh and look for a small fly box with both dry and wet if you find yourself here, just downstream from Sandia Cave, the famous archaeological site!!!

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437), Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the Sportsman's Elite fly shop (915-587-4867) in El Paso. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
