President's Corner

So, my term in office is up. David Carmichael will become the new club president at the banquet next month. David is a far more knowledgeable fly fisher than I and I look forward

to his newsletters and programs. Thanks to everyone for their support during the last two years. I especially want to thank Chuck Mueller for organizing the club trips, Tom Wobbe for keeping us organized and Jim Hulsey for keeping us informed. Without their years of hard work and dedication, the job of president would be impossible and the club would be a lot less active and interesting. So tell them thanks when you see them.

Tim Cammisa is our guest speaker at the annual banquet on February 20th. In addition, Tim will give a fly tying demonstration from 10:00am to noon at the NM Game and Fish Classroom. Tim is an extremely knowledgeable and entertaining fly fisher, fly tier and speaker. Check out his videos on YouTube. We plan to do another stream improvement project the second weekend in March. The vanes and baffles we put in last fall are holding up well and doing their job. I don't know yet how many volunteers we will need, but watch for an email from Tom Wobbe. The Kids' Fishing Clinic is set for April 2nd at Alumni Pond. This is the club's community outreach project and we can always use as many volunteers as we can get, so save the date.

I went to Taos for the annual Rio Grande Cutthroat Trout Recovery Team meeting on January 27th and 28th. The meeting involves a number of state and federal agencies and private groups in New Mexico and southern Colorado who share knowledge and coordinate activities in an effort to keep the RGCT off

of the threatened or endangered species list. There are similar groups and efforts underway for the Gila Cutthroat Trout, Blacknose Dace and Rio Grande Chub and Sucker. Of interest to people in our part of the State, it looks like the plan to stock RGCT in the Las Animas River and Bonito Creek won't get underway before 2018.

I came up on Monday night in a snow storm. The Taos area received seven to eight plus inches of snow. Through January 28, 2016, all of the major river basins in New Mexico and southern Colorado are at or above 100% of their median snowpack. Thank you El Niño! More snow in the forecast for the next month, so it should be a good fishing year.

From all reports, fishing at the lease is good. In mid-December, Mary and I (inspired by Bob Widgren's presentation) decided to try Czech nymphing at the lease. After consulting innumerable websites and videos, we got rigged appropriately and ventured forth. In about three hours, we each caught a half dozen or more fish. Mary caught two in the 16" range and I caught one about that size. Outfished again!

Thanks again for all of your support over the last couple of years. Don't forget to buy your raffle tickets and don't hesitate to get more involved. We need some new blood in the club's leadership.

Saturday, February 20 Chuck Mueller

After viewing many of <u>Tim's videos on YouTube</u> and really enjoying both his tips and tricks on techniques

for Fly Tying, I contacted Tim and he agreed to be our guest speaker for the banquet. As of this month he has had over 1 million views of his videos on YouTube.

A quick bio: Tim lives in western Pennsylvania and has been tying flies for over 25 years. His fly fishing has taken him all over the country, with his "home base" being in the State College just outside of Pittsburg. Tim started making fly tying tutorials on YouTube and his audience has grown to over 6,500 subscribers. You can view those videos on his website, Trout & Feather.

Tim's topic for the banquet will be "Strategies for Success in Differing Water Types" with his talk consisting of the similarities and differences between strategies used for small stream, spring creeks and freestones, and tailwaters. There will be an emphasis on preparation, rod/line selection, gear, fly choices, reading of the water and reflection.

Tim will hold a fly tying clinic for us on Saturday morning from 9am to Noon. He will be tying several different patterns for us from nymphs, drys to some anchor flies on a jig hook and if time permits the Meat Whistle. You can come and watch or tie along with Tim. In any case, I think you will enjoy this clinic and Tim.


Fishing Report

Editor's Note:—Chase Tucker, one of our members from Lubbock, sent us this report which was received on 11 January.

Just wanted to give you an update with how last weekend went. It was a little slow, but picked up in the afternoon. The fish were being picky, and after throwing a handful of flies, we found that Hare's Ears and Pheasant Tails were the go-to patterns. Beautiful sunny day, with temperatures



getting up in the mid 40's. Water was clear, and the ground wasn't as muddy as the week before. I decided to use my Orvis Clearwater 2wt and personally caught about 9 rainbows, and probably 20 chubs (this was getting a little annoying – ha ha). However, I had a good fight on the 2wt with a nice chunky 18" rainbow (first fish of the day actually)! I will definitely be back soon!



MVFF Board Meeting Minutes

Monday, January 18, 2015 Submitted, John Kennedy, Secretary

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F Conference Room by President Jim Sorenson. Board members present were Jim Sorenson, Chuck Mueller, Gary Mann, David Carmichael, Dennis Lanpher, John Kennedy, Ray Rodriquez and Jeff Arterburn. Non-Board members in attendance were Ron Bellerose, Tom Wobbe, Jim Hulsey and Paul Turner. Will Lubenau and Dominique Lujan from the American Fisheries Society were also in attendance.

- 1. Minutes of the December 15, 2015 Board meeting were approved as published in the January, 2016 issue of the newsletter.
- 2. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$11,861. The Treasurer's report was accepted and approved.
- 3. Tom Wobbe reported the Club's membership at 321; 34 from the Lubbock area; Las Cruces at 80–85; 50 El Paso; 10 Alamogordo; 8 from Carlsbad, etc. 287 permits were sold in 2015.
- 4. Ron Bellerose reported on Project Healing Waters. 2015 was a very successful year. Future outings include the Wounded Warriors Transition Team going to the University pond; and a spring outing for the Fort Bliss disabled Veterans. Ron is going to attend a conference in March in Orlando, Fla., a 3 day event.
- 5. Jeff Arterburn reported for the Gila/Rio Grande chapter of Trout Unlimited. Jeff recently attended a T.U. recovery meeting. Several topics were discussed including recreational gila trout restocking recently done between Lake Roberts and Gila Forest area. Other areas are being studied for suitable habitat restocking.

- 6. The American Fisheries Society annual meeting will be scheduled in Flagstaff, Arizona.
- 7. The Annual Meeting and Banquet will be on Saturday, February 20, 2016 at St. Paul's Methodist Church. The Guest Speaker will be Tim Cammisa. Fly tying that day will be from 10am to 12:30pm at the NMDG&F Conference Room. Tim will tie 3 to 4 patterns. At the Banquet and Raffle he will discuss fishing stream tactics, tailwaters and freestone. Bob Widgren has donated a Czech Nymph rod for the raffle.
- 8. The NM Game and Fish Commission Reform effort was discussed. MVFF will not take a position at this time. The Fish Action Plan has not yet come up before Game & Fish.
- 9. The NM Wildlife Federation Public Lands Rally for 1/21/2016 was discussed.
- Round 2 of our Lease Stream Improvements project will probably take place the 2nd weekend in March. More later.
- Club Officers elected for 2016 are: David Carmichael, President; Jim Sorenson, Vice-President; John Kennedy, Secretary and Gary Mann, Treasurer.
- 12. We are looking for speakers for the March and May general meetings.
- 13. The Kids Clinic will be on Saturday, April 2 at the University Pond. MVFF will supply some prizes, pizza and drinks. \$600 was approved for expenses.

The next Board meeting will be February 15, 2016. Meeting was adjourned at 8:20pm.

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575–524–1880), Tom Wobbe (575–522–5437) and Donna Mabie (575–522–3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575–687–3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
