I welcome everyone to a new and productive year and hope that we can accomplish our goals for the coming year. After driving over 2,000 miles to visit with relatives and friends during the holidays I am glad to be back in New Mexico. I am looking forward to our annual awards banquet on the 12th and hope to see many of you this year. As I often tell many non-members, the Mesilla Valley Flyfishers is a great group to work with on various activities because our

members are always willing to help. Being president during 2007 was an enjoyable learning experience and I will try to help MVFF become more effective in providing activities for its members in 2008. My first goal for the new year is to have a great awards banquet and plans are shaping up nicely for this event at St. Paul's Methodist Church. Another major goal will be to organize more club trips that are appealing and convenient for the members. I have checked the scale samples that we took on our electrofishing survey in October and can now confirm that most of the rainbow trout in the 9 to 12-inch range were from natural spawning and reached that size in one growing season! These trout should continue to grow rapidly during 2008 as the food supply is great. Because they will not yet be sexually mature until next fall all of their growth during the spring and summer will be in increased length and weight. This should make for excellent fishing this year so plan on spending some time on the Rio Peñasco in 2008.

I want to personally thank all the members for their help during 2007. We always have willing members when we need help on any club event. We have two new board members for 2008 that will bring new ideas and energy to MVFF. Serving on the board and participating in various activities is how we maintain an active and effective club. I know that my participation on the board and as an officer has cemented my commitment to MVFF. 
There will be a public comment meeting at the NMDG&F office on January 28. The topic will concern the use of multiple flies. The meeting will start at 6:00pm.

Kodiak Quarterly - 2nd Edition

This is the second article in a series for those thinking about going on the fishing trip to Kodiak, Alaska in the fall of 2008. The idea of this series is to make information available to you in advance of the trip so that there is enough time to plan and save for the trip. If you have any

questions, call me at 575-522-6325 or Tom Wobbe at 575-522-5437. We will try our best to answer any questions about the trip. Scheduling the time to coincide with the coho run is the key to having a successful trip. salmon mature in the ocean and they return to the tributary streams of the Kodiak Road System drainages to spawn. Each year, the Alaska Game and Fish Department monitors the of returning

salmon through placement of a weir on the Buskin River, and through foot surveys of the Pasagshak and Olds Rivers that are conducted during the peak periods of the spawning run. I have been in touch with Leonard Schwartz, the fisheries biologist with the Alaska Game and Fish on Kodiak. According to historical data, 25 % of the returning cohos have usually entered the rivers by September 5th, 50% by September 15th and 90% by September 25th. He said good fishing continues through mid-October, when fish begin moving toward the spawning grounds and go off the bite. With any luck, the tentative dates of September 20, 2008 to September 27, 2008 or September 27, 2008 to October 4, 2008 should put us near the peak of the run.

In March 2008, Tom Wobbe and I will host a planning meeting at the Game and Fish Office at 7PM for those interested in the trip. As soon as we have a firm date for the meeting, it will be posted on the MVFF website and in the newsletter. Plan to make your airline reservations by May 2008 to book the best rates and reserve seats. Air travel to Kodiak involves flying to Anchorage and then connecting with either Alaska Airlines or ERA Aviation for the one hour flight to Kodiak. We have found that scheduling a flight that

arrives in Anchorage as early in the day as possible is best to make the connection to Kodiak in case of weather delays. For fishing equipment, an 8- or 9-wt. rod and reel is the best option. The road system streams are a delight with no raging currents or 50-yard casts, just clear riffles alternating



with deep pools and gravelly bars. Some streams have steep brushy banks. A floating line with weighted flies is perfect for these rivers. In addition, cohos are known to chase big deer hair flies on the surface. Coho's are not leader shy. We use a heavy 7 1/2 foot leader and a 10 to 12 pound test tippet. To reach fish in some of the deeper holes, I used a short (5 foot) piece of sink-tip looped between the floating line and leader to get the fly

down deep quickly. We have used a wide variety of colorful (black, purple, hot pink, chrome, white-green, and chartreuse) and highly visible fly patterns sizes 6 to size 2 including Clousers, marabou Trompler Specials, black and purple egg sucking leeches, and black-white bunny leeches. The weather is cool and damp and changes rapidly. The temperature in the fall will range from the low 40s to the low 60s. Be prepared for rain and dress in layers. Most of the time, I have been very comfortable wearing lightweight fleece pants, a long sleeve undershirt, and a light wool (or fleece) shirt under breathable waders and a wading jacket. But if the weather gets colder, I am ready to add another layer plus a cap and light gloves. Cotton doesn't dry well so wool or synthetic clothing is the most comfortable for the Kodiak climate.

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from any of the Club Officers or Board Members and are also available at the *Angler's Nook* (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the ATF fly shop in El Paso (915-225-0570.) Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
