Another great year for Project Healing Waters thanks to all our great volunteers. It has been a great month for fly tying and fishing. We tied flies on December 23<sup>rd</sup> and again on

December 30<sup>th</sup>. I greatly appreciated Ray Rodriquez for his participation in the fly tying event on December 30<sup>th</sup>. He did a great job of assisting our new fly tying Vets and I could not have done the class without his help.

Statistics for 2015 are as follows: new vets – 87, new volunteers – 17, fly tying events – 28, casting events – 10, fishing events – 26.

We had a total of 314 Vets participate in 2015 with a total hours spent of 2,030. We had a total of 213 volunteers for the year with 1,883 hours spent with the Vets. Thank you so much for the MVFF volunteers that make this program possible.

Also PHW had a total of \$4,790 in 'In kind' donations, \$1,900 in personal donations, and \$1,600 in fund raisers and fly sales. Thank you all for your support.

## NM Native Trout Resolution for 2016

Hopefully you are enjoying the year's ending with



reminiscences of fine fishing and good times on the water, and are eagerly looking forward to angling in the New Year. Who among us isn't inspired by the chase for wild trout in wild places, where the only

thing better than bringing a particularly fine fish to net in the quiet solitude and beauty of a remote canyon or meadow stream is sharing the experience with a close friend or family member? Sustainable fisheries for wild trout are treasures to be enjoyed, without the need for stocking or interventions other than avoiding impairments to their water quality or the systemic damages to the watershed from fire or drought. So it's not surprising that even ardent an



glers may give pause when asked what makes *native* trout special, and they may wonder why so much emphasis is placed on protecting and restoring *natives*? New Mexico is home to two remarkable native trout species: the Rio Grande Cutthroat Trout and the Gila

Trout. These fish are uniquely beautiful in their own ways, with distinguishing characteristics being the dappled spots and brilliant orange highlights on an olive palette or fine spots peppering a golden coppery bronze background, respectively. The behavior of these natives have also adapted to fit their home waters amazingly well, taking advantage of streamside



cover to survive in the low water and increasing temperatures, and challenging the fly angler's fishing skills and knowledge. When you catch and release a native trout in one of the uniquely beautiful, special places in NM, where they've lived for thousands of years, it is an experience to savor.

Fortunately we have some excellent opportunities to enjoy recreational fishing for these native trout, and with the continuing efforts and support from a broad base of public and private constituents and multiple federal and state agencies, there is hope that these opportunities will further improve and expand. In January, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will be stocking ~10,000 Gila Trout in the Gila Forks area and the recently renovated Lake Roberts for recreational fishing. Restoration of Rio Grande Cutthroat Trout in the South Fork of Bonito Creek could be possible following the construction of a fish barrier to exclude non-native trout. The path for RGCT restoration in Animas Creek now depends largely on recovery of the stream from the damage caused by the Silver Fire in 2013. ## Tim Cammisa, Banquet Speaker

After viewing many of [Tim's videos on YouTube](#) and really enjoying both his tips and tricks on techniques for Fly Tying, I contacted Tim and he agreed to be our guest speaker for the banquet. As of this month he has had over 1 million views of his videos on YouTube.

A quick bio: Tim lives in western Pennsylvania and has been tying flies for over 25 years. His fly fishing has taken him all over the country, with his "home base" being in the State College just outside of Pittsburgh. Tim started making fly tying tutorials on YouTube and his audience has grown to over 6,500 subscribers. You can view those videos on his website, [Trout & Feather](#).

Tim's topic for the banquet will be "Strategies for Success in Differing Water Types" with his talk consisting of the similarities and differences between strategies used for small stream, spring creeks and freestones, and tailwaters. There will be an emphasis

on preparation, rod/line selection, gear, fly choices, reading of the water and reflection.

Tim will hold a fly tying clinic for us on Saturday morning from 9am to Noon. He will be tying several different patterns for us from nymphs, dries to some anchor flies on a jig hook and if time permits the Meat Whistle. You can come and watch or tie along with Tim. In any case, I think you will enjoy this clinic and Tim.

### Custom Rod for Raffle

David Carmichael has built a custom rod for this year's raffle. A description is given below along with David's business card.

Sage ONE 9 ft., 4wt.—Rod is built with a Struble flor grade (highest quality) reverse half wells cork grip, REC up-locking reel seat and a California buckeye burl insert. The stripping guide is a Struble black agate guide. The winding check, tip top and other guides are Snake Brand. The rod blank is black, and the wraps are burgundy with embedded spiral trim bands in light gold. Rod retails for \$795, but the up-grades are worth \$120, so it's a \$900 value.

Thread: brown 8/0
Body: brown turkey biot or long goose biot
Thorax: hare mask dubbing, olive
Over wing: brown biotechnology with pearl flash tinsel coated with UV knot sense.

Semi-Realistic Caddis



Hook: Daiichi 1120 or 1130 size 18-14
Body: Foam 1/4 or 2mm brown
Thread: Brown 8/0 or 14/0
Wing: Light Brown Medallion Sheeting
Legs: All Purpose Natural Deer Hair
Hackle: Brown or Brown/Olive size 16
Antenna: Optional Brown Micro Fibetts

Extra tools needed: Long sewing needle

### MVFF Board Meeting Minutes

Monday, December 15, 2015

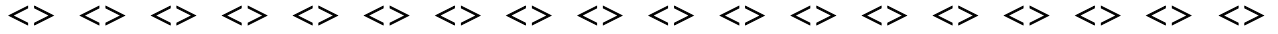
The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7:00pm at *The Game Restaurant* by President Jim Sorenson. Board members present were Jim Sorenson, Chuck Mueller, Gary Mann, Paul Turner, Jeff Arterburn and John Kennedy. Non-Board members in attendance were Tom Wobbe, Ron Bellerose and Jim Hulsey.

1. Minutes of the November 16, 2015 Board meeting were approved as published in the December issue of the newsletter.
2. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$11,502. The Treasurer's report was accepted and approved.
3. Tom Wobbe reported the Club's membership at 318 with 8 new members joining since the November general meeting. Chuck Mueller suggested a notice in the January 2016 newsletter that the Club would again begin mentoring classes for newer members. Tom Wobbe reported that 262 permits for the lease were sold in 2015. There was also discussion that the Club will be setting up a Pay Pal account in the near future to handle Club monetary transactions - more information later.
4. Ron Bellerose reported on Project Healing Waters. PHW will slow down slightly in the winter months, but 7 vets will be building rods. PHW has received several donations recently from Club members. The Club encourages donations for this very worthwhile cause, and the fantastic work the Ron Bellerose and his volunteers do. Checks may be made payable to "Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing" with "Las Cruces NM area" written on the memo line. Checks can be given to Ron.
5. Jeff Arterburn provided the Gila/Rio Grande Chapter - Trout Unlimited Report. There is a Gila Trout Recovery Program meeting in mid-January. Jeff will report further on this in the near future.
6. The Annual Banquet & Raffle is scheduled for Saturday February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at St. Paul's Methodist Church. Raffle prizes have been purchased. Raffle tickets were recently emailed to members, and are available at meetings.
7. Jim Sorenson reported on the Game & Fish Commission Reform meeting that he recently attended. The Commission rejected the State Wildlife Action Plan, but it will continue to be discussed. The State Fisheries Action Plan is not being discussed yet. For further information, see the Dept. of Game & Fish website.
8. There will be a NM Wildlife Federation Public Lands Rally at the State Capitol on Jan. 21<sup>st</sup>. The issue for discussion concerns Western States seeking federal lands being deeded over to the States. The Club supports keeping these public lands as they are now. If there is enough interest, the Club may rent a bus for members to attend. There will be a sign up sheet at the January general meeting.
9. Recent lease improvements and fish stocking were discussed, both successful so far. More discussion will follow at the January 2016 meeting.
10. We need speakers for the March and May general Meetings. Our January meeting speaker will be Kevin Campbell from Lee's Ferry.

The next Board meeting will be January 18, 2016. Meeting was adjourned at 8:20pm.

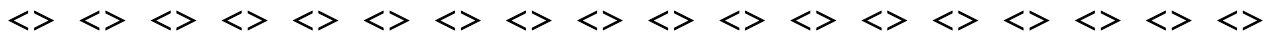

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.

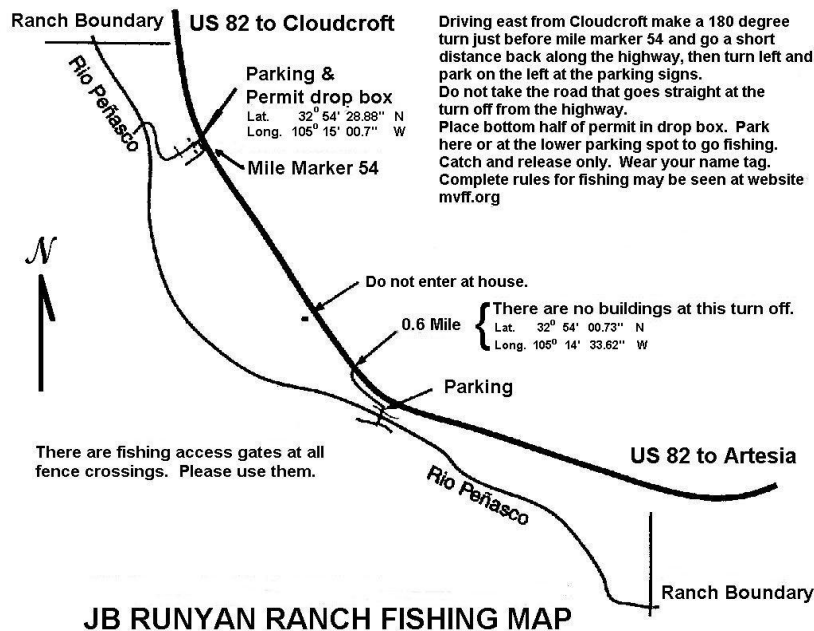

### Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437) and Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for guests.

#### Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
