President's Corner



Although the fishing wasn't as good this year as last year, the twelve MVFF members who went to the Big Horn all caught plenty of fish and had a good time. In early June, the Bureau of Reclamation reduced the flows on the river

to 2,900cfs and began releasing water from the top of the dam instead of the bottom. The combination of warmer water and abundant sun light caused the algae to grow like mad. After the first half mile below

the dam, it was hard to get a very long drift before the flies picked up a wad of "moss," "spinach," "cabbage" or a "long, skinny, green fish". The river bottom was so blanketed that hatches of aquatic insects were also greatly reduced. A majority of the guides stuck with nymph rigs and floated the upper three miles twice, relying on the clients to clean their flies and get them back in the water as guickly as possible. David Palmer found a nice run below the three mile takeout where wading and sight fishing Another guide overcame their were productive. skepticism and convinced Jim and Randy Hulsey to fish streamers. They spent the afternoon pounding the banks with great results until their casting arms fell off. The last night of our trip, the Big Horn Water Users Alliance had their third annual "Big Lips" Carp tournament and banquet. We all enjoyed a nice barbecue dinner and a blue grass band that had taken second place at this year's Telluride Blue Grass Festival.

I am looking forward to seeing as many as can make it to the Club's next trip to the Conejos River from July 10th to the 13th. We are planning to camp at the Mogote campground. The summer monsoon rains are projected to begin this week, so it should be cool weather and good fishing. In addition to the Conejos, its tributaries and the Los Pinos are within easy reach.

Finally, Kevin Holladay in the Santa Fe office of New Mexico Department of Game and Fish called to tell me that MVFF has been selected as the Volunteer Organization of the Year by the Aquatic Resources and Education Division of the Department. We will be recognized and receive a plaque at the Department's annual banquet on August 16th in Albuquerque, which is held in conjunction with their outdoor expo that weekend. There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437) and Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
