## Norm Mabie Memorial Scholarship Winner

Stephanie Coleman has been selected as the 2006 recipient of the Norm Mabie Memorial Scholarship by the Board of Directors of the Mesilla Valley Flyfishers. Ms. Coleman is a graduate student in the Department of Fishery and Wildlife Sciences at New Mexico State University. Her graduate research relates to evaluating the impact of forest fires on the population ecology of Gila trout in the Gila National Forest. She has worked as a fishery biologist with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in New Mexico since 2001 and has extensive field experience working with the biological and water resources of the San Juan, Rio Grande, Pecos, and Gila rivers. Previous full-time work includes stints as a wildlife technician with the U.S. Forest Service and Arizona Game and Fish Department, maintenance worker at San Bernadino National Wildlife Refuge and as a research specialist and lab manager with Arizona State University.

Stephanie assisted the club during the annual Kid's Fishing Clinic and really appreciates the financial assistance provided by the MVFF. We expect Ms. Coleman will attend one of our monthly meetings this fall and describe the status of her research and the restoration efforts for the Gila trout.

## Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear

The center of attention for the Liars and Tiers this month will be the Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear. The Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear is an old fly which has been around for a couple of hundred years or so. It is often attributed to Victorian tier James Ogden and was popularized by Frederick Halford in the late 1880s. Traditionally, to give it it's bug like appearance, the pattern used fur from a hare's ear, mingling the longer guard hairs with the lighter colored under fur and dubbing for a body. Rabbit fur is easier to obtain and now more widely used. The mayfly nymph can be imitated quite well with a large gold ribbed Hare's ear. It can be fished either weighted or unweighted. It has won fans everywhere and ranks as one of the better general purpose flies. It is a good fly for the Rio Peñasco. Hook: TMC 9300 6-22 Thread: Tan, brown, black, 6/0, 8/0 Weight: Med. or small lead wire Tail: Hares Ear Fur, short Wingcase: Turkey Quill slip Body: Rabbit, natural, brown, tan, olive ,black, etc Ribbing: Copper or gold wire, reverse wrapped forward Thorax: Same as body, or darker tones


## Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters can be obtained from any of the Club Officers or Board Members and are also available at the *Angler's Nook*. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (505-687-

3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$20.00 per day with student permits (ages 12 through 17) costing only \$12.00 per day. Kids under 12 fish free. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

#### Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
