If you missed the annual banquet on February 7th, you missed a good one. presentation by Landon Mayer was as good as any I have ever heard, the food was excellent and congratulations to the

Matt Zeigler and Eric Mammoser are teaching a class in stream management in the NMSU Fisheries Department this semester. On April 11 and 12, they will be taking approximately 20 students in the class to the Lease to measure stream flows; type, size and quantity of fish; and available food sources. In lieu of a final exam, the students will be divided into teams and given the task of preparing a proposal to improve the stream as a trout fishery. Matt and Eric will provide copies of the proposals to the MVFF Board to use as a guide to improving that stretch of the river. Hopefully, future classes can evaluate the efficacy of those improvements and make further suggestions for improvement.

In connection with that stream improvement project, the Board is announcing the Spring Rod Raffle. Club member Mark Lenarz has made and donated a beautiful, hand-crafted bamboo fly rod with two matching tips. Beginning in March, we will be selling a maximum of 50 raffle tickets for the rod at \$20 each. In order to let as many as want to participate in the raffle, we are setting a limit of two tickets per member until after April 13th. After the April General Meeting, members will be able to purchase as many of the leftover tickets as they wish. All of the proceeds of the raffle are dedicated to making stream improvements on our leased section of the Rio Peñasco. So, here is your opportunity to win a high quality fly rod and improve the area we all fish for a pretty nominal amount.

April is shaping up to be a busy month. On April 1st, Project Healing Waters will host soldiers from Ft. Gila National Forest Plan Revision

The process of revising the existing forest plan for the Gila National Forest is beginning, with opportunities for public participation and input. The first phase of the process involves assessment of the current conditions and trends of forest resources and multiple uses. The plans set management, protection and use goals and guidelines. Monitoring conditions on a forest ensures projects are done in accordance with plan direction and determines effects that might require a change in management. Six "Community Conversations" public meetings are scheduled during the month of March 2015 (details below). These events are being held to learn how people value the forest and why it is important to them, and get your ideas about how to organize the agency's outreach and involvement efforts. When this process is completed, the revised plan will describe the strategic direction for management of forest resources for the next 10 to 15 years. — http://www.fs.usda.gov/detail/gila/home/?cid=STELPRD3828671

MVFF Board Meeting Minutes

Monday February 16, 2015 Submitted by John Kennedy, Secretary

The MVFF Board Meeting was called to order at 7:00pm in the NMDG&F Conference Room by President Jim Sorenson. In attendance were Jim Sorenson, Chuck Mueller, Bob Silver, Dennis Lanpher, John Kennedy and non-members Ron Bellerose, Jim Hulsey, Tom Wobbe, Dominique Lujan and Will Lubenau from the American Fisheries Society, and Helen Zagona.

- 1. Minutes of the January Board meeting as published in the February newsletter were approved.
- Tom Wobbe presented the Treasurer's report, and financially the Club is in good shape with \$11,734 in the bank. The Treasurer's report was accepted as read.
- 3. Membership is at 234 active members through March. Nine new members have joined the Club since January 1.
- 4. Helen Zagona presented a proposal to donate Al Trompler's fly fishing books to the Club for a library. Her generous offer was accepted, and the titles will be posted on the Club's website. Members will be able to check out 2 books at a time with a 1 month loan period. Bob Silver will serve as librarian.
- 5. Eric Mamoser from NMSU is involved with a new course at the university, "Fisheries Management." Twenty students are interested in possible lease improvements. Their deadline is early April. Ideas for improvement include quantatative assessments for the stream, fish, etc. The group intends to prepare 2 written plans to explain their management ideas. Ideas kicked around included shoreline preservation, creation of pools, flow patterns, flooding and designs for damage control. Oral and or written presentations of their work will come by the May meeting, or the fall meeting.

- 6. 100 people attended the 2015 annual banquet which was a great success. Speaker Landon Mayer presented an excellent slide/video abbreviated discussion of his book, 101 Trout Tips. It was well received. All agreed that the food and prizes were excellent. There was further discussion on future speakers, prizes, and expenses.
- 7. Ron Bellarose presented a report on Project Healing Waters. 4 Veterans were at the banquet. 75 % of the veterans are club members. On April 1 there will be fly tying at the NMDG&F Conference Room, and fishing at the lease will be on April 8. On May 13 there will be fly tying in Cloudcroft, and fishing at the Cloud Country Pond on May 14. These 2 activities will include spouses and kids. Some of the Vets have been fishing at Alumni Pond with some success. 7 Vets are presently building fly rods.
- 8. It was agreed that the American Fisheries Society will do a fly tying session at the NMDG&F Conference Room on March 14. They will do a presentation at the March meeting. They will again do a presentation on invertebrates at the kids fishing clinic on April 4.
- 9. There was further discussion of a possible club general meeting in April in El Paso.
- 10. Club member Mark Lenarz donated a beautiful custom made bamboo fly rod for the Spring Raffle. 50 tickets will be sold at \$20.00 per ticket, 2 tickets maximum per purchase. The money raised from the spring raffle will be designated for lease improvements.
- 11. Chuck Mueller reported that the North Platte trip, June 21 26, is almost full, and the San Juan trip, April 30 May 3, is about ½ full.

The next board meeting will be March 16th, 2015. Meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm.

For Sale: David Carmichael—Now that I'm building rods, I'm looking to clear out some of the rods I have stored in various corners of the house. I'd like to make these 4 rods available to club members before I list them for sale on eBay:

- 1. 2 Scott rods: E2 905/4 These rods are used, but well cared for. Miriam and I have caught many fish with them. Discontinued model, original retail price was \$525, so they are mid-range rods. Asking \$100 each.
- 2. 2 Fly Logic rods: Fly Logic rods are mid-range, very good quality rods made in Melba, ID. I was introduced to them by a guide in Kodiak, Alaska who uses them for salmon, Dolly Varden and trout. These rods are very slightly used and in great condition. The FLP+ designates their mid-level rod (retail \$295), and the FLO+ is their highest level rod (retail \$535). They were purchased for a trip to Alaska that has not happened yet, so someone else might as well get some use from them. (I have caught Northern Pike on the 8wt in the Rio Grande near Taos)

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575–524–1880), Tom Wobbe (575–522–5437) and Donna Mabie (575–522–3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575–687–3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
