Guide, fly designer, author and lecturer, John Tavenner has been fly fishing and fly tying for over 30 years. John began fishing the San Juan River in 1985 and started guiding the river in 1988. In 1999 he and his wife started Sandstone Anglers, a guide service focused primarily on the San Juan River. John is the only FFF certified casting instructor on the river. Sandstone Anglers' guides average about 15 years of experience guiding the San Juan. The presentation, Tackle and techniques for fishing the San Juan River, will give the viewer not only an idea how to fish this great river, but a greater knowledge of how to become a better fisherman on all rivers. A fresh look at some of the techniques that are rarely talked about, such as mending, extending drifts and fighting and landing big fish on light tackle. A must see for any one thinking about fishing the San Juan, or who just want to become a better fishermen.

Copper John

The center of attention for the Liars and Tiers this month will be the Coipper John. The Copper John is a relatively new fly, designed by John Barr, that has won fans everywhere and ranks as one of the best general purpose flies. It is one of the better flies for the Rio Penasco. It is a relatively heavy fly and reaches down deep in large pools. It is primarily a trout fly, but can be effective for warm water species as well. Detailed step-by-step tying instructions can be found at http://www.troutflies.com

It was originally tied with regular copper wire but other colors, such as red or green, are also used.



Hook: TMC 5262, 5263 10-18

Thread: Black, 6/0, 8/0

Bead: gold-plated brass, 1/8" with tapered hole

Weight: med. or small lead wire

Legs: Partridge

Tail: Biots, Brown, Black Goose or Turkey

Wingcase: Thin Skin with Flashabou center strip, epoxy finish Body: Medium copper wire. An underbody of thread, tapered

Thorax: Peacock herl

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
