

MVFF Board Meeting Minutes Monday, April 13, 2015 Submitted by John Kennedy, secretary

The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 7pm in a meeting room at *The Game* by Vice President Chuck Mueller. In attendance were Chuck Mueller, Gary Mann, John Kennedy, Jeff Arterburn, Dennis Lanpher, Paul Turner, and non-Board members Jim Hulsey, Ron Bellerose, Tom Wobbe, and Will Lubenau and Dominique Lujan from the American Fisheries Society.

- 1. Board minutes of the March Board meeting as published in the April newsletter were approved.
- 2. The Treasurer reported that the Club has \$14,772 in the bank. The Treasurer's report was accepted.
- 3. Tom Wobbe reported that as of April 1, 2015 the club has 255 members. Members need to pay their dues to remain current. The spring raffle is underway to raise money for stream improvements at the Lease. 50 tickets are being sold at \$20.00 per ticket for a chance to win a beautiful bamboo fly rod made and donated by member Mark Lenarz.
- 4. Ron Bellerose reported on Project Healing Waters. 169 veterans' hours were spent in the 1st quarter of the year, and 120 volunteer hours. There were 6 fly tying events, and 1 casting event. On May 13th there will be fly tying for the Wounded Warriors in Cloudcroft, and on the 14th fishing, sponsored by the Cloudcroft VFW. On the 15th of May there will be fly tying at Fort Bliss for the Wounded Warriors Transition Battalion.
- 5. Jeff Arterburn reported that the State Council for Trout Unlimited will be asking for new board members for the Gila Rio Grande Chapter. Please

contact Jeff at 575–524–0773 if interested. Jeff also mentioned that the State Council will soon begin a newsletter for all state chapters.

- 6. Dominique Lujan reported that the American Fisheries Society will hold their dept. banquet at 7pm at the Farm & Ranch Museum April 24th with guest speaker Jerry Marrichini. There will be a raffle and auction, and department scholarships will be announced. The Club donates money for these scholarships.
- 7. On April 11th & 12th, 6 NMSU students and 2 professors went to the Lease to study the stream, including some shocking. A lot of chubs and several trout were caught. The rainbows seem to be reproducing. Their report will hopefully be coming out the 1st week of May, including recommendations for management and improvements. This project is being spearheaded by Professor Matthew Ziegler.
- Upcoming club trips were discussed. The spring trip to the San Juan is April 30th to May 3rd. 15 members are going. The North Platte trip is June 21-26. 18 members are signed up.
- Tom Wobbe discussed the recent Kids Clinic. 66 kids signed in. Expenses totaled \$441.00. The Clinic was well received. Next year a Club committee will handle organization & setup of the Clinic.

The next Board meeting will be Monday, May 18, 2015 at 7:00pm.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm.

For Sale: David Carmichael—Now that I'm building rods, I'm looking to clear out some of the rods I have stored in various corners of the house. I'd like to make these 4 rods available to club members before I list them for sale on eBay:

- 1. 2 Scott rods: E2 905/4 These rods are used, but well cared for. Miriam and I have caught many fish with them. Discontinued model, original retail price was \$525, so they are mid-range rods. Asking \$100 each.
- 2. 2 Fly Logic rods: Fly Logic rods are mid-range, very good quality rods made in Melba, ID. I was introduced to them by a guide in Kodiak, Alaska who uses them for salmon, Dolly Varden and trout. These rods are very slightly used and in great condition. The FLP+ designates their mid-level rod (retail \$295), and the FLO+ is their highest level rod (retail \$535). They were purchased for a trip to Alaska that has not happened yet, so someone else might as well get some use from them. (I have caught Northern Pike on the 8wt in the Rio Grande near Taos)

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575–524–1880), Tom Wobbe (575–522–5437) and Donna Mabie (575–522–3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575–687–3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
