Fish to be Stocked at Lease

Saturday, 5 November

As many of you know, recent rains have resulted in large amounts of ash from last spring's forest fire being washed into the Rio Peñasco resulting in the killing of many of the fish at the Lease. The Board has decided to restock this fall with the date set for 5 November. Plans are to stock about 500 fish. Volunteers will be needed when the time comes and reminders will be sent out. Volunteers will be able to fish without a permit after the stocking is complete. We need volunteers to help with the stocking to distribute the fish from the truck to the stream by a bucket brigade. The stocking truck will be at the lease at 9 AM. Those that wish to car pool to the lease should meet at the K-Mart on Highway 70. The carpool will leave at 6:30 AM sharp! Otherwise we will see you at Jim Ellett's house at 9 AM. Bring a clean plastic bucket, lunch and a jacket. Also bring your fishing gear. Large boulders will be added to the stream on the 5th as well to improve the fish holding habitat near the lower bridge.

Here is another fly from Tim Mack which has been working well at the Lease recently.



Hook: TMC 2487, or Mustad C49S #16 to #22

Thread: UNI 8/0 gray

Tail: Antron yarn gray or light gray

Body: muskrat gray or Adams gray dubbing

Post: 1/16" white (or color of choice) foam cylinder Hackle: Whiting Farms medium dun saddle hackle

Details: double nymph dropped from a poundmeister (a taylor streight original) to anything 16 to 18 olive. hare's ears did the best. noticed a lot of olive caddis larvae on rocks...hit edges of fast current by slack water...caught a lot of snags above and below the water but the closer we got to the Rio Grande the bigger and wider the fish got....lots of rainbows and a few browns...biggest bow 18"/ biggest brown 11"





MVFF Board Meeting Minutes

Monday, October 17, 2011 Submitted by Jim Sorenson, Secretary


The MVFF Board meeting was called to order at 6:50pm in the NMDG&F conference room by President Chuck Mueller. In attendance were Chuck Mueller, Jeff Arteburn, Ron Warnke, Gary Mann, Bob Silver, Jim Sorenson, George Sanders, and Ron Bellerose and non-Board members Al Trompler, Tom Wobbe and Jim Hulsey.

- 1. Minutes of the September 2011 Board meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.
- The Treasurer reported that the Club has a balance of \$12,270 in the bank. Revenue and expenses from the Club's San Juan trip were approximately equal. The Treasurer's Report was accepted.
- Tom Wobbe reported that the Club has 193 paid members; with 76 from Las Cruces, 36 from El Paso and the remainder from elsewhere.
- 4. Ron Bellerose reported that Project Healing Waters had a fly tying class on September 29 with 13 volunteers and 28 soldiers; a casting clinic on October 13 with 7 volunteers and 20 soldiers; and a trip to the lease on October 20th. He made a presentation to 13 veterans at the Las Cruces Veterans' Center, which was well received. He has submitted a proposed budget of \$2,000 for 2012. There was a discussion on how to increase PHW volunteer participation. A motion was approved for the Club to provide two free lease permits for each PHW trip to the lease and each fly tying class and one permit for each casting clinic. There will be a drawing for the permits

- among the volunteers who participate in each of those events.
- Ron Warnke reported that six hats were sold and 18 remain.
- 6. Chuck Mueller reported that he has been unable to reach Dutch Salmon who is the scheduled speaker for the November general meeting. He will contact Paul Turner to get an updated phone number.
- There is an opening for a speaker for the December general meeting. Suggestions were made and a program will be decided upon at or before the next Board meeting.
- After a lengthy discussion, a motion was approved to spend \$1,000 to stock fish and \$500 to place large rocks to improve fishing at the Lease.
- Jeff Arteburn reported Colleen Caldwell brought nine NMSU students to the recent Aqua Chiquita work day. A workday for the Black Canyon project has been scheduled for October 29.
- 10. There was a brief update on the annual banquet in January and the Kids' Fishing Clinic to be held either April 7 or 14, 2012.
- 11. A motion was approved to move the Liars and Tyers meeting to November 30th to avoid a conflict with the Thanksgiving holiday.
- 12. The next Board meeting will be Monday, November 21 at 7:00pm.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00pm.

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437), Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces and the Sportsman's Elite fly shop (915-587-4867) in El Paso. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town guests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
