We are into November but don't put your fly rods away yet. On October 25th, we stocked the Lease with 450 trout between nine and 13 inches. While we were stocking, David Carmichael

spotted four 20-inch trout in a pool above the lower bridge. By now, the trout we stocked should have settled in and begun feeding on the chubs and grasshoppers, both of which were in plentiful supply. It is time to get up to the Lease and catch some fish before the herons do.

The New Mexico Department of Game and Fish has announced the opening of the Hammond Tract, a new 80 acre aquatic park on the San Juan River about 14 miles south of Navajo Dam. The park includes a half mile of river with 15 in-stream structures and has been stocked with hybrid rainbow trout. Ron Bellerose and I are going on the Club's San Juan River trip this week. We will check it out and report on it at the November meeting and in the next newsletter.

We have finalized the prize list for the Club's annual raffle which includes three guided trips, three fly rods, two reels and much, much more. Raffle tickets go on sale this month, so please help support the Club's activities and take a chance on upgrading your gear and enjoyment of the sport.

Project Healing Waters had a very busy October. We had 26 new Vets introduced into fly fishing. In addition to the new participants we had 3 fishing events, 3 casting events, and 2 fly tying events. We had a total of 40 participating Vets and 23

volunteers. The Vets had a total of 276 hours and the volunteers put in 165 hours. Thanks to all the volunteers, PHW in this area is a success.

We will have a major fishing event on the 5th of November; expecting 20 Vets and 10 Staff members at the lease. This event requires as many volunteers as we can get. The CowBelles will be providing lunch/dinner for all of us and that alone is worth the trip.

Stocking the Lease

Saturday, 25 October was stocking day at the Rio Peñasco. Club members gathered to meet the fish truck at about 9:30am and proceeded to the stream to stock 200 11- to 13-inch rainbows and about 250 9- to 11-inchers. The fish looked very good and were placed through out the stream! The was an active insect hatch around 10-10:30am. Grasshoppers were also seen! The weather was fabulous and everyone had a great time. David and Miriam Carmichael stayed to do a little fishing afterwards so don't miss their report later in this newsletter. Fishing Report

After the stocking, Miriam and I stayed and fished for about 3 hours (2-5pm) in the middle section of the lease. Caught about 30 fish, but only three were trout; all the rest were chubs. Hopefully the stocking will help alleviate the recent imbalance in species.

The water was clear and 60 degrees, but about a foot low, so many of the shallower runs didn't provide good holding water. The deeper runs and holes are the ticket. We saw baetis spinners ovipositing, but no hatches during our time on the water.

None of the trout we caught were from the stocking; two were larger (15" and 16"), and one smaller. The 16-incher made a real fight of it for my 486-4 Z Axis, with head shakes and 6 runs that stripped line off the reel. Even though there were hoppers everywhere, we only had three takes on hoppers, including the small trout. We used the smallest hopper patterns we had, size 12; the larger sizes were not productive at all, even though many of the naturals were larger. All the rest of the hook ups were on a dropper bead head PT

or Copper John, size 20 or 22. Had a couple of follows while landing chubs, so a streamer with chub coloring might do some good in the deeper holes. We saw some of the stocked fish still swimming around looking for cover or jockeying for position in the weedy section above the natural gravel dam upstream from the lower bridge, but they should be settled in by the time the Healing Waters group gets there on Wednesday. Saw some really large fish in that section.

Hook: TMC 300 or equivalent streamer hook
Thread: Uni 6/0 or Ultra 70 denier, tan or brown

Bead: brass or gold cone head, small **Wing:** natural rabbit zonger strip

Body: pearl ice dubbing

Under body (optional): lead free weighted wire

Gills: rubber legs, tan

Throat/gills: red ice dubbing

There are several options for the payment of dues. A family is defined as a club member, their spouse and all children 17 years of age or under.



Lease Information

Permits to fish the Club leased waters on the Rio Peñasco can be obtained from Jim Hulsey (575-524-1880), Tom Wobbe (575-522-5437) and Donna Mabie (575-522-3810) in Las Cruces. Permits can be obtained from the land owner, but you should phone (575-687-3362) the night before to ensure someone will be there to sell them to you. Permits can be ordered through the club web page (mvff.org) by filling out the form and mailing as directed. Cost is \$25.00 per day. Kids under 18 fish free but must be accompanied by an adult club member with a permit. You must be a current member (current dues have been paid) of MVFF to fish the lease. Please wear your MVFF identification badge while on the property. New or replacement badges can be obtained by contacting Jim Hulsey. In addition, members can purchase a one-day, one-time permit for out of town quests.

Directions to the Lease:

Follow NM 82 east from Cloudcroft, NM or west from Artesia, NM. The turn off to the lease is located on the right side of the road about 100 yards before mile marker 54 coming from Cloudcroft or 100 yards on the left past mile marker 54 coming from Artesia.
